Oulline

I. In 1 Kings 17, Elijah appears on the scene with no introduction of his family history or how he came to know the Lord.

And Elijah the Tishbite, who was of the inhabitants of Gilead, said unto Ahab, As the LORD God of Israel liveth, before whom I stand, there shall not be dew nor rain these years, but according to my word.

1 KINGS 17:1

- A. There is no indication in Scripture that Elijah even knew King Ahab or had any political clout or special access to King Ahab; just the opposite is implied.
- B. Ahab and his wife, Jezebel, were trying to stamp out the worship of the true God of Israel in favor of the pagan worship of Baal.
- C. Elijah put his life at risk by coming to Ahab.
- D. People were afraid to speak of their faith in the Lord.
- E. In many ways, it was very similar to what we see happening today.
- F. Many believers are cowed into submission just as the people of Elijah's day were.
- G. Where did Elijah get the boldness to do this?
- H. It was the word he had from God.
- II. God's Word is powerful (Heb. 4:12).
 - A. It's like a fire that devours anything in its path (Jer. 5:14).
 - B. It's also like a hammer that breaks into pieces everything that opposes it (Jer. 23:29).
 - C. Anyone with a word from God is never inferior to those who don't have a word from the Lord.
- III. You may be thinking, *I wish I had a word from the Lord*.
 - A. You do—you have millions of words from the Lord in your Bible!
 - B. It's not the lack of God speaking that is the problem; it's the lack of people realizing what they have in God's Word and acting on it that is the problem today.
 - C. If that's you, you just haven't fully recognized and truly understood what you have.
 - D. Maybe you allow the world and the fear of man to intimidate you (Prov. 29:25) and make you feel like you're the one who is weird for being moral and believing that some things are absolute.
 - E. But you're the one who has the revelation of God's Word—the problem is you just aren't as bold with it as Elijah was.

- IV. What would have happened if Elijah had just stayed in his prayer closet and only *prayed* about this word God had spoken to him about the drought?
 - A. Well, even if the drought had come, King Ahab wouldn't have recognized it as being the hand of God, and he would have written it off as circumstance and coincidence.
 - B. I'm sure that when Elijah boldly spoke what God had told him, it was really easy for the king to just reject this.
 - C. But as the drought manifested over time...

There [was] no nation or kingdom, whither [King Ahab] hath not sent to seek [Elijah]: and when they said, He is not [here]; he took an oath of the kingdom and nation, that they found [him] not.

1 KINGS 18:10, BRACKETS MINE

- D. Elijah's boldness to go straight to the very top and speak forth the word is what set his whole ministry in motion.
- V. Boldly speaking forth and acting upon the Word of God in faith will set your life and ministry in motion.
 - A. It doesn't matter if a word on salvation, Holy Spirit baptism, or healing is all you have; the average person doesn't know that.
 - B. You have to speak up to make a difference!
 - C. Today, many people have substituted prayer for speaking forth and acting on God's Word.
 - D. Elijah could have prayed from then until Jesus came, but nothing would have happened if he hadn't been bold enough to go speak the word and act on it in faith and obedience.
 - E. The devil will try to make you think you just don't have enough—I certainly had to deal with that.
 - F. But then I discovered His Word and found out that it was God's Word that produces the fruit (Mark 4:14-20).
 - G. If the Lord has shown you any truth—spoken anything to you—then you have something that will ignite miracles if you're bold enough to act on that word and speak it!
- VI. The Scripture reveals that this second word concerning Elijah's direction, protection, and provision came *after* he had already been bold and stepped out in faith on the previous word:

And [then] the word of the LORD came unto him, saying, [3] Get thee hence, and turn thee eastward, and hide thyself by the brook Cherith, that is before Jordan. [4] And it shall be, that thou shalt drink of the brook; and I have commanded the ravens to feed thee there.

1 KINGS 17:2-4, *New International Version*, Brackets and Underline Mine

[23] And Elijah took the child, and brought him down out of the chamber into the house, and delivered him unto his mother: and Elijah said, See, thy son liveth.

[39] And when all the people saw it, they fell on their faces: and they said, The Lord, he is the God; the Lord, he is the God.

I. Further direction came to Elijah after he stepped out in faith and acted on the initial word he had been given:

And the word of the LORD came unto him, saying, [3] Get thee hence, and turn thee eastward, and hide thyself by the brook Cherith, that is before Jordan. [4] And it shall be, that thou shalt drink of the brook; and I have commanded the ravens to feed thee there.

1 KINGS 17:2-4, UNDERLINE MINE

- A. God hid, protected, and provided for him during this period of time.
- B. Notice where the Lord sent this provision: "*I have commanded the ravens to feed thee there*" (1 Kin. 17:4, underline mine).
- C. God made provision for Elijah, but it was sent "there"—where the Lord told him to go.
- II. Whenever God tells you to do something, He always makes full provision for you.
 - A. Yet I've seen people who have stepped out on a word from God, and instead of seeing the provision, they suffered many problems instead, which makes you wonder, *What happened to these folks? Was God faithful?*
 - B. God sent the supply to where He told Elijah to go—not to where he was.
 - C. Yet, if he had stayed right where he was, then as far as Elijah was concerned, he could have starved to death, wondering, *God*, *where are You? I stepped out on Your word, but where's Your supply?*
 - D. If you don't follow through on what God has told you to do, you can miss His supply.
 - E. You have to be in the right place to receive.
- III. When Jamie and I first started out in ministry, we were told, "If you're called to be a minister, then you're sinning against God if you get a job!"
 - A. Due to this misconception, I did many things wrong, which hindered our finances and our ability to receive God's provision.
 - B. I had to constantly battle thoughts like: God, it's not working. You aren't faithful. I'm doing what You told me to do, but where's the supply?
 - C. Later, the Lord showed me that it's proportional.

Even so hath the Lord ordained that they which preach the gospel should live of the gospel.

1 CORINTHIANS 9:14

- D. When you are ministering full time, you can expect to live off the Gospel full time.
- E. In the meantime, it's wisdom to do something else to help support yourself and your family.
- F. It took me years to get this through my thick skull!
- G. I had a pure heart, but I refused to receive God's provision, because I thought I would be sinning against my calling if I got a job.
- IV. Elijah knew he was in the right place when he saw the provision of bread and flesh, because God had already sent the provision.

So he went and did according unto the word of the LORD.

1 KINGS 17:5

- A. Obedience matters!
- B. Obedience doesn't change God's heart toward you, but if you aren't obedient, you can certainly make it hard on yourself.
- C. There is an anointing on just being obedient to God and doing what He says.
- V. After struggling for most of the first ten years of our ministry, we finally began to see a small measure of success in the second place I pastored, Childress, Texas.
 - A. But the Lord had spoken to me to go to Pritchett, Colorado, to pastor a small church.
 - B. So, we went there out of nothing but sheer obedience, not expecting anything in return, but that's where our ministry exploded.
 - C. Nobody in their right mind would have ever thought that Pritchett was "there" for anyone, but that's what God told me to do!
 - D. I believe God has something like that in everyone's life.
- VI. You can look at all the major characters in the Bible and see that God has asked just about every single one of them to do something completely illogical.
 - A. The Lord asked Abraham to sacrifice his son.
 - i. It looked like he was killing the promise, but that was "there" for him.
 - B. You can probably think of something the Lord has asked you to do like that.
 - C. It's just how He operates!
 - D. If you're missing out on His supernatural supply, it's because you aren't "there"; i.e., you aren't doing what you know in your heart God has called you to do.
 - E. Even by stepping out, taking a risk, throwing caution to the wind, and doing everything God tells you to do, it will still often take a great miracle to see something happen.

- F. But if you aren't even doing what you know in your heart God has called you to do, then you don't stand a chance to succeed.
- G. The Lord might do a few things to test you, but He'll never do anything to hurt you.
- H. If you're not "there," why not?
- I. Do what the Lord tells you to do.

I. Your place called "there" is an attitude of wholeheartedly moving in the direction of, and doing, what God has said for you to do.

So he went and did according unto the word of the LORD: for he went and dwelt by the brook Cherith, that is before Jordan. [6] And the ravens brought him bread and flesh in the morning, and bread and flesh in the evening; and he drank of the brook.

1 KINGS 17:5-6

- A. When God calls you to do something, His supply is both supernatural and natural.
- B. You need to keep these things in balance.
 - i. You can be in a ditch by always looking for your needs to be met in a totally natural, human way.
 - ii. The other ditch is just expecting God to rain your supply out of heaven while refusing to do anything according to natural wisdom.
- II. Sometimes people have trouble understanding this interaction between the natural and the supernatural.
 - A. At one point in time, the board of Andrew Wommack Ministries told me we were bankrupt on paper.
 - B. But that same day, an offering came in from a church for \$60,000!
 - C. It was definitely God, but it wasn't totally supernatural.
 - D. I had spoken a word to the fellow who started that church, and he had wanted to bless me back.
 - E. Therefore, this timely provision from God was both natural and supernatural.
- III. One of my partners is a big giver, but he's always on my case, saying, "If you have a need, don't put out a letter or tell anybody; just pray to God, and He will supernaturally meet your need."
 - A. That sounds great, but the Word says,

Ye have not, because ye ask not.

JAMES 4:2b

- B. It's wrong to just expect God's provision to be one hundred percent supernatural.
- C. However, it's also wrong to just get out there and try to figure it all out in the physical realm.

- D. God will tell you natural things to do, but there will also be a supernatural supply.
- E. Elijah had supernatural bread and meat, but he also had natural water.
- IV. At another time, a partner brought his accountant into our ministry to look things over.
 - A. This accountant said, "On paper, you're bankrupt, yet you're still functioning and things are working."
 - B. Then, after a more thorough check, he told us to bleed our inventory down to bare bones.
 - C. Since then, we haven't had a financial crisis in our ministry.

And it came to pass after a while, that the brook dried up, because there had been no rain in the land.

- A. There are progressive steps toward the fulfillment of anything God has for you to do.
- B. The Christian life is a relationship—it's dynamic and progressive.
- C. At times, God is going to change some things in your life.
- D. Will you go on to the new "there" or get stuck?
- II. Elijah had received, proclaimed, and obeyed the word of the Lord—the brook didn't dry up because he had done anything wrong.
 - A. You might think you will never have any problems if you just do what God tells you to do, but this just isn't so!
 - B. The vast majority of believers functionally interpret whether or not they're doing what the Lord wants them to do by how easy it is.
 - i. If something comes against them, they think they've missed God.
 - C. God's blessing and anointing will be on your life when you're really obeying Him, but that doesn't mean that everything in the physical realm will be going right.
 - D. In fact, you can usually tell whether or not God is in what you're doing by how much opposition there is.
 - E. That's about the way it goes in Scripture.
- III. Elijah was in that place called "there," but the brook dried up.
 - A. It was his own prophecy that brought the drought.
 - B. But to Elijah's credit, he didn't move just because the brook dried up.
 - C. In a situation like this, when the supply has quit and something has to change, most people wouldn't wait on a word from God, and they would do something out of panic.

I. God led Elijah to a new place:

Behold, I have commanded a widow woman there to sustain thee.

1 KINGS 17:9

- A. The Lord had already spoken to this widow before He told Elijah about her, which was exactly the same thing He did with the ravens (1 Kin. 17:4).
- B. God sent Elijah to a specific woman—Jesus Himself said,

But I tell you of a truth, many widows were in Israel in the days of Elias [Elijah], when the heaven was shut up three years and six months, when great famine was throughout all the land; [26] But unto none of them was Elias sent, save unto Sarepta [Zarephath], a city of Sidon, unto a woman that was a widow.

LUKE 4:25-26, BRACKETS MINE

- C. Perhaps she had heard about Elijah's prophecy and knew that this drought had been caused by the man of God.
- D. She could have been believing the Lord to send Elijah her way, because she knew she was supposed to sustain him.
- E. It's also possible that God had just shown her that somehow or another He was going to miraculously provide for her through the drought.
- II. Elijah knew this wasn't just any woman but "the" woman:

So he arose and went to Zarephath. And when he came to the gate of the city, behold, <u>the</u> widow woman...

1 KINGS 17:10a, UNDERLINE MINE

A. God had a place called "there" for the widow woman, too, and that's where she was!

The widow woman was there gathering of sticks.

1 KINGS 17:10b, UNDERLINE MINE

B. This woman wasn't out there praying, laying hands on the sick, or doing anything "holy"; she was just picking up sticks.

- C. This may not seem very significant, but she was "there"— doing what she knew to do, which put her in the right place at the right time.
- D. You might want to do all these super spiritual things, yet sometimes you'll encounter some of the most awesome miracles just doing the things God has called us to do.
- E. If you aren't living the Christian life in everyday things, you could miss out on your miracle because you are too "spiritual!"
- F. God has called you to do a lot of things that aren't necessarily super spiritual.
- G. Sometimes you might look down on those things and not do them with as much joy as all the spiritual stuff.
- H. Be faithful to do what God has called you to do; remember, this woman was "there," picking up sticks.
- III. If you were getting ready to make your last little bit of food and then die, and somebody came to you and asked for a drink of water—would you give it to them?

And he called to her, and said, Fetch me, I pray thee, a little water in a vessel, that I may drink. [11] And as she was going to fetch it...

1 KINGS 17:10-11a

- A. For this woman to go and actually serve Elijah first says a lot about her.
- B. I believe that's one of the reasons God chose her over everyone else.
- C. She was a giver.
- D. She was someone who didn't just think only of herself.
- E. Many of us aren't willing to serve anybody on a good day, much less a bad one.
- IV. Remember, Elijah knew this was "the" woman.

He called to her, and said, Bring me, I pray thee, a morsel of bread in thine hand.

1 KINGS 17:11b

- A. He wasn't just asking this randomly to check her out; he was doing this on purpose.
- B. This was a divine connection, and she already had a word from God, but I believe she was wavering in her faith a little bit:

And she said, As the LORD thy God liveth, I have not a cake, but an handful of meal in a barrel, and a little oil in a cruse: and, behold, I am gathering two sticks, that I may go in and dress it for me and my son, that we may eat it, and die.

1 KINGS 17:12

- C. She was believing Him for supernatural supply, but not strong enough to speak it.
- D. This is exactly the reason God led Elijah to ask for her last little bit of food: She needed to take a step of faith and get beyond that doubt and unbelief.
- E. You'll find this truth also in the ministry of Jesus.
 - i. When someone was pointed out to Jesus, He told them to go do something.
 - ii. If you study this out, you will find that the people who didn't make a step toward Him were given something to do.
 - iii. To those who took steps toward Him, He said things like, "According to your faith be it unto you" (Matt. 9:29).
- V. Elijah knew he had the widow woman's miracle, but if he didn't become aggressive and get her out of her negative attitude, she was going to miss God's provision.
 - A. Most of us would feel sympathy for that woman, and instead of taking her last little bit, we would shell out and give to her.
 - B. However, giving her some food might feed her one more day, but taking from her what she had would give her a supply that would last nearly three years!
 - C. Many times, our compassion is misdirected.
 - D. People don't need a hand out but a hand up.
 - E. Elijah was saving this widow woman's life by asking for her last little bit of food.
- VI. As ministers, we need to challenge God's people to give and then receive their offerings with the right attitude—it's one of the best things we can do for them!
 - A. Ministers, myself included, haven't been bold in the area of finances because we don't want to be perceived as being after people's money.
 - B. We have let the devil intimidate us into thinking we are receiving the offering for us, when in reality, we're receiving it for them!
 - C. When we minister on finances and become bashful and apologetic, we'll lose the anointing and power of finances.
 - D. As ministers, it's our responsibility to challenge believers to step out in faith.
 - E. We need to push them to get out there and do what God has called them to do!

[31] And his disciples said unto him, Thou seest the multitude thronging thee, and sayest thou, Who touched me? [32] And he looked round about to see her that had done this thing. [33] But the woman fearing and trembling, knowing what was done in her, came and fell down before him, and told him all the truth. [34] And he said unto her, Daughter, thy faith hath made thee whole; go in peace, and be whole of thy plague.

Oulline

I. The Word says that Elijah didn't just tell this widow woman "Give me your food"; he gave her a promise, or a word from God, to go with it:

And Elijah said unto her, Fear not; go and do as thou hast said: but make me thereof a little cake first, and bring it unto me, and after make for thee and for thy son. [14] For thus saith the LORD God of Israel, The barrel of meal shall not waste, neither shall the cruse of oil fail, until the day that the LORD sendeth rain upon the earth.

1 KINGS 17:13-14

- A. Elijah gave her the word of God—the same word he had been living under and that had been meeting his need.
- B. You don't encourage people to give without giving them the Word of God to anchor their faith.
- II. Notice how Elijah said, "Make me thereof a little cake <u>first</u>" (1 Kin. 17:13, underline mine).
 - A. You need to challenge folks to give God their best, because they want to give what they can afford—what's left over after their needs are taken care of.
 - B. They aren't putting the Lord and His kingdom first (Matt. 6:33).
 - C. I'm not legalistic with this, but when you give God your best, He begins to give you His best.
- III. This widow woman had to give to Elijah first every day until the drought ended.
 - A. She didn't give to Elijah once and get three years' supply of oil and meal.
 - B. There was always that tiny little bit, but it never failed!
 - C. There was never so much that she could just coast and say, "Well, I don't have to believe God today."
 - D. Every morning, she faced this choice—make for the man of God first and believe that there will be enough for her and her son, or not.
 - E. She had to exercise her faith every day to obey the word of the Lord.
 - F. Most of us would like to get enough to set two or three years' worth aside, so we can feel safe and secure.
 - G. But the Bible says,

Give us this day our daily bread.

MATTHEW 6:11

- H. This is how the Lord met her need.
- I. What a tremendous lesson!
- J. You don't have to experience everything on your own; you can learn from the examples recorded in God's Word.
- IV. This woman's giving not only affected her but also her son who died later in this chapter (1 Kin. 17:17-23).
 - A. She had been giving, so she had a right to make a demand on Elijah to raise up her son.
 - B. There was no precedent for this, nothing to encourage Elijah, yet he went in and raised this woman's son from the dead.
 - C. This was a result of the faith she demonstrated through her giving.
- V. Faithful giving won't just open a door for you in your finances; it will open a door for you in many other areas of your life and ministry.

He that is faithful in that which is least is faithful also in much: and he that is unjust in the least is unjust also in much. [11] If therefore ye have not been faithful in the unrighteous mammon [money], who will commit to your trust the true riches?

LUKE 16:10-11, BRACKETS MINE

- A. Jesus called money the "least" area of stewardship.
- B. If you can't trust God in finances, you're not operating in enough faith to really trust Him in healing, deliverance, and other things either.
- C. If you can't trust God with your money, how are you ever going to trust Him with your eternal salvation, health, family, church, ministry, or anything else?
- D. Faithfulness in finances is the starting place.
- VI. Everyone in the body of Christ is at varying stages of growth, ministry, and God working in their lives.
 - A. However, the Lord's thoughts and plans for each of us are "thoughts of peace, and not of evil, to give you an expected end" (Jer. 29:11).
 - B. The Lord has destined us for success!
 - C. Success with God isn't the same as worldly success.
 - D. We need to be careful how you evaluate success.
 - E. It's not just dependent on numbers, finances, and other such things.

VII. God wills for every one of us to succeed in whatever area He's planted us in.

- A. There's a perfect plan, but there are some things we need to go and do.
- B. We need to be faithful and take those steps, just like the widow of Zarephath.
- C. We can't receive God's provision if we won't step out in faith and do what He tells us to do.
- D. Many times we struggle because we aren't "there."
- E. We have a word from God—it's time we stepped out in faith!

- I. The truth is that most of us never stretch ourselves out in faith; therefore, we don't need God to do anything.
 - A. We don't ever go out and lay hands on somebody to be healed, because we're afraid it won't work, but if we don't lay hands on them, nothing will happen for sure!
 - B. Most of us have never allowed ourselves to get in a position where we need a supernatural manifestation of the power of God—we play it too safe.
 - C. The fruit is out on the limb, but we're all hugging the trunk.
 - D. We need to get out there where it feels a little insecure.
 - E. Until we get to where we're doing something beyond our ability, there's no reason for God to show up and do a miracle.
 - F. God will always cause us to do the thing that seems impossible.
 - G. The Lord will lead us to do something strange, uncomfortable, and different.
- II. We have a word from God, but we've been timid and shy about it.
 - A. We need to have the same kind of attitude as Elijah—not arrogance, but confidence, knowing what God has done in our lives.

- II. Jesus said "My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me" (John 10:27) and "A stranger will they not follow, but will flee from him: for they know not the voice of strangers" (John 10:5).
 - A. This is not the experience of many Christians.
 - B. They complain about not being able to hear the voice of God, but then they'll turn around in the next breath and say, "The devil told me I'm never going to hear God's voice. Satan says this and Satan says that."
 - C. We need to tune in and start listening to God's voice!
 - D. Most of the time, we don't hear what God is saying to us because we aren't inclining our ears and paying attention.
- III. We don't draw on the word of the Lord enough—it's available, but we have to appropriate it!
 - A. Elijah didn't do anything until he heard a word from God.
 - B. Many of the problems we get into today are totally self-created.
 - C. We blame the devil, and of course, the Enemy takes advantage of everything we give him, but we can save ourselves a lot of problems by just getting to the place where we hear the voice of the Lord.
- IV. When the word of the Lord came to Elijah and said "Go show yourself to Ahab," that's what he did.

And Elijah went to show himself unto Ahab. And there was a sore famine in Samaria. [3] And Ahab called Obadiah, which was the governor of his house. (Now Obadiah feared the LORD greatly: [4] For it was so, when Jezebel cut off the prophets of the LORD, that Obadiah took an hundred prophets, and hid them by fifty in a cave, and fed them with bread and water.) [5] And Ahab said unto Obadiah, Go into the land, unto all fountains of water, and unto all brooks: peradventure we may find grass to save the horses and mules alive, that we lose not all the beasts.

1 KINGS 18:2-5

A. This famine had been so severe that it looked like they were going to start losing their livestock.

And it came to pass, when Ahab saw Elijah, that Ahab said unto him, Art thou he that troubleth Israel?

1 KINGS 18:17

B. Ahad tried to make Elijah responsible for all of his problems, but notice Elijah's response:

And he answered, I have not troubled Israel; but thou, and thy father's house, in that ye have forsaken the commandments of the LORD, and thou hast followed Baalim.

1 KINGS 18:18

- C. Satan is an intimidator, an accuser who, sooner or later, will twist things around so that you're the problem.
- D. You can see this big time in society today.
- E. Because of his intimidation, most Christians are afraid to speak the truth and act on the word God has given them.
- F. This was exactly what Ahab was trying to do to the prophet, but Elijah answered, "I haven't troubled Israel. It's you and your house who have brought all this upon yourselves!"
 - i. The same thing happened with Jesus when they brought a demonized boy to Him.
 - ii. The father said put the ball entirely in Jesus' court (Mark 9:22).
 - iii. But the Lord wasn't going to accept responsibility that wasn't His.
 - iv. He knew this boy's father could believe God, so He turned it back onto him (Mark 9:23).
- G. The devil will constantly try to put all of the burden and responsibility on you.
- H. Elijah just refused to receive it.
- I. He wasn't about to be intimidated by the devil, and neither should you!

Oulline

I. Elijah just showed up on the scene, and the word from God put him in control.

Now therefore send, and gather to me all Israel unto mount Carmel, and the prophets of Baal four hundred and fifty, and the prophets of the groves four hundred, which eat at Jezebel's table. [20] So Ahab sent unto all the children of Israel, and gathered the prophets together unto mount Carmel.

1 KINGS 18:19-20

- A. At first, nobody knew who he was.
- B. But since Elijah was bold enough to speak the word the Lord had given him—even when nothing at the time was happening—it gave him credibility when things came to pass.
- C. If you stick around long enough, you'll see the Word of God put you in a position of authority every single time.
- D. However, you must be truly speaking God's Word—not just your own doctrines and social issues.
- E. Sooner or later, the Word of God will *always* exalt you.
- II. God doesn't actually exalt ministers—He exalts His Word.
 - A. We put so much emphasis on our actions and charisma, but if we look at the people God has used throughout history, many of them had nothing going for them.
 - B. All they had was the word of the Lord and genuine faith in it.
 - C. Speaking specifically of the Jews who had rejected the Gospel, Hebrews 4:2 says,

The word preached did not profit them, not being mixed with faith in them that heard it.

- D. We need to mix the Word we've heard with faith.
- E. If we speak the word God has put in our mouths, it will give us authority in the lives of people.
- III. The word of the Lord in Elijah's mouth had been proven—it came to pass.

If any man speak, let him speak as the oracles of God.

1 PETER 4:11

- A. Elijah, a prophet, told the king what to do, and he did it—that's the way it ought to be.
- B. There was a time when the church commanded an authority in people's lives.
- C. We've become apologetic and substituted other things.
- D. We need to be authoritative with the Word of God.
- E. We don't have to condemn people—we can do it in love, but we must be bold and speak the Word of God.
- F. As ministers, we're supposed to challenge people to make a decision.

And Elijah came unto all the people, and said, How long halt ye between two opinions? if the LORD be God, follow him: but if Baal, then follow him. And the people answered him not a word.

1 KINGS 18:21

- G. But many times, we're afraid to do this because they might make a wrong choice and it'll work against us.
- H. People may leave, but we must bring them to a place of commitment.

IV. Elijah knew better than this:

Then said Elijah unto the people, I, even I only, remain a prophet of the LORD; but Baal's prophets are four hundred and fifty men.

1 KINGS 18:22

- A. Remember, he'd just been told that there were still a hundred prophets being hid out in caves (1 Kin. 18:13).
- B. He thought he was the only one left serving God, but the Lord still used him.
- C. We don't have to be perfect for God to use us.
- D. This doesn't mean it's okay to have problems.
- E. But even though these wrong attitudes and mistakes in our lives are deadly and we need to deal with them, the Lord will still use us.
- F. We cut ourselves off—not God!

They that observe lying vanities forsake their own mercy.

JONAH 2:8

- G. When we observe lying vanities, we open ourselves up to the devil.
- V. Elijah called for a test, saying, "Let's see who the real God is!"

Let them therefore give us two bullocks; and let them choose one bullock for themselves, and cut it in pieces, and lay it on wood, and put no fire under: and I will dress the other bullock, and lay it on wood, and put no fire under: [24] And call ye on the name of your gods, and I will call on the name of the LORD: and the God that answereth by fire, let him be God. And all the people answered and said, It is well spoken.

1 KINGS 18:23-24

- A. We're the ones who have the power, reality, and anointing of the Lord.
- B. We would silence many people if we just started demonstrating things.
- C. We need to be bold—God is bigger than we've ever thought about, yet we're afraid we're going to say something and promise something that the Lord can't deliver.
- D. It's not really putting the Lord on the spot—it's putting *us* on the spot.
- E. God is willing and able; He's more than capable.
- F. When I pray for people, I am doing nothing but operating as a believer.
- G. It's just a prayer of faith based on God's Word, and I see miracles happen all the time.
- H. Every believer can do this (Mark 16:20).

VI. Paul declared in 1 Corinthians 4:19-20,

But I will come to you shortly, if the Lord will, and will know, not the speech of them which are puffed up, but the power. [20] For the kingdom of God is not in word, but in power.

- A. Basically, Paul was saying, "We're going to solve this problem when I come. Those of you who have any power operating in your life can talk. But if you haven't healed any sick, cleansed any lepers, ministered sight to the blind, or raised someone from the dead in the last month or two, then you have to sit down and shut up!"
- B. We need to be more aggressive in our faith.
- C. The people are ready for this; we're the ones playing it safe.
- D. Why? We're afraid to preach it because then we'll have to manifest it.
- E. We're the ones the fear originates from.
- F. On the whole, we are the ones who set the tone in our ministries.
- G. If we aren't seeing the miraculous power of God operate, then we don't have to look for our problem any further than our mirror.

Oulline

- I. Elijah mocked these people (1 Kin. 18:25-27) because he knew the power of God.
 - A. Most of us honestly just aren't that confident in God's power.
 - B. We don't really doubt that He can; we doubt that He will.
 - C. Why? Because we know that we aren't everything that we should be.
 - D. We don't have to be perfect for God to use us!
 - E. We let the devil talk us out of our miracles—not because we doubt that God has the power, but because we doubt His willingness to use it.
 - F. Really, we doubt ourselves because we don't understand the grace and mercy of God.
- II. Do you know what they were doing by leaping on the altar and cutting themselves?

And they cried aloud, and cut themselves after their manner with knives and lancets, till the blood gushed out upon them.

1 KINGS 18:28

- A. They were offering their works as a sacrifice.
- B. This same attitude operates in many Christians today—they think God will use them because of their great sacrifice and the things they do.
- C. However, it's only by the grace of God!
- D. You need to extract ourselves out of these things.
- E. You need to put all the pressure and responsibility on Him—He can handle it!
- F. That's not what these priests and prophets were doing by yelling, leaping, and cutting themselves—they thought that somehow their works would cause Baal to answer.
- G. And of course, nothing happened.

And it came to pass, when midday was past, and they prophesied until the time of the offering of the evening sacrifice, that there was neither voice, nor any to answer, nor any that regarded.

1 KINGS 18:29

III. This whole test was supernatural.

And Elijah said unto all the people, Come near unto me. And all the people came near unto him. And he repaired the altar of the LORD that was broken down. [31] And Elijah took twelve stones, according to the number of the tribes of the sons of

Jacob, unto whom the word of the LORD came, saying, Israel shall be thy name: [32] And with the stones he built an altar in the name of the LORD: and he made a trench about the altar, as great as would contain two measures of seed. [33] And he put the wood in order, and cut the bullock in pieces, and laid him on the wood and said, Fill four barrels with water, and pour it on the burnt sacrifice, and on the wood. [34] And he said, Do it the second time. And they did it the second time. And he said, Do it the third time. [35] And they did it the third time. And the water ran round about the altar; and he filled the trench also with water.

1 KINGS 18:30-35

- A. There was a bullock and wood, but no fire; however, just so nobody misunderstood and claimed "spontaneous combustion," Elijah had all this water poured over it.
- B. Although it was hot and dry because of the drought, only God would be able to set fire to this sacrifice.
- C. Most people wouldn't do something like that—they would struggle with their own unbelief.
- D. But Elijah believed God.
- E. What has God called you to do? Is there opposition to you and your word from the Lord?
- F. Don't be afraid—anyone with a word from God is bigger than all of their opposition.
- G. If you have faith in the word from God, nothing will shake you.
- H. If the Lord has called you to do what you're doing, then it will work.
- I. The only thing that can stop you is your unbelief.
- IV. Elijah knew this drought was going to last years "*There shall not be dew nor rain these years*, but according to my word" (1 Kin. 17:1, underline mine).
 - A. During this drought, Elijah must have asked the Lord and meditated on how it would end.
 - B. But somehow or another, Elijah had already seen all these things that would happen coming to pass.
 - C. That's what he was praying here in 1 Kings 18:36:

And it came to pass at the time of the offering of the evening sacrifice, that Elijah the prophet came near, and said, LORD God of Abraham, Isaac, and of Israel, let it be known this day that thou art God in Israel, and that I am thy servant, and that I have done all these things at thy word.

UNDERLINE MINE

- D. God had planted all these things inside Elijah and instructed him in it.
- E. If you can't see it on the inside, you'll never see it on the outside.
- F. Elijah had already seen these things happen—he saw himself challenging the prophets of Baal and knew what the outcome would be.

- G. You need to take God's Word and let it paint a picture.
- H. You need to get to where you can see it!
- I. Elijah had already seen these things in his heart, so he said that he was doing "all these things at thy word" (1 Kin. 18:36).
- V. Nobody had ever called fire down before.

Hear me, O LORD, hear me, that this people may know that thou art the LORD God, and that thou hast turned their heart back again. [38] Then the fire of the LORD fell, and consumed the burnt sacrifice, and the wood, and the stones, and the dust, and licked up the water that was in the trench.

1 KINGS 18:37-38

- A. And it all happened because the word of the Lord came to this guy, and he meditated on it, spoke it boldly, and acted on it in obedience.
- B. The same thing can happen with us.
- C. We need to hear a word from God, get bold with it, and speak it.
- D. We'll go through some hard times.
- E. Elijah went through the drought and suffered like everybody else.
- F. It took faith to get up every day and see that provision, but he believed God—and the fire fell!

And Elijah the Tishbite, who was of the inhabitants of Gilead, said unto Ahab, As the LORD God of Israel liveth, before whom I stand, there shall not be dew nor rain these years, but according to my word.

Oulline

- I. The fire of God doesn't just fall anywhere—Elijah had to repair the altar (1 Kin. 18:30).
 - A. If you catch on fire, the world will come watch you burn!
 - B. If you repair your altar and spend time in the presence of the Consuming Fire Himself (Heb. 12:29), your life will be set ablaze with His glory and power.

And when all the people saw it, they fell on their faces: and they said, The LORD, he is the God; the LORD, he is the God.

1 KINGS 18:39

- C. This is the first revival recorded in Scripture.
- D. Elijah turned the entire nation back to God through one awesome miracle!
- II. We cannot be effective ministers of God ministering in word only.
 - A. There must be some power and demonstration to go with it.
 - B. We believers still have that power—we just aren't using it.
 - C. Even though the Word we have is superior to what Elijah had (2 Pet. 1:19), we don't have the same faith and confidence in it that he did.
 - D. Yet look what he accomplished—Elijah killed 450 prophets of Baal and 400 prophets of the groves (1 Kin. 18:19).

And Elijah said unto them, Take the prophets of Baal; let not one of them escape. And they took them: and Elijah brought them down to the brook Kishon, and slew them there.

1 KINGS 18:40

- E. As New Testament believers, God doesn't want us to go out and kill all the people who aren't preaching the truth.
- F. However, we do need to get so adamant that we pursue and eradicate all the devil's inroads into our lives.
- G. We should hate everything Satan is doing and refuse to take no for an answer!
- III. Every truth in God's Word has an apparent opposite.
 - A. Therefore, as much as you believe in God's love, you must also hate the devil.
 - B. Romans 12:9 says, *Abhor that which is evil; cleave to that which is good.*

- C. These are apparent opposites.
- D. However, you can't just cleave to that which is good and ignore evil; you must hate that which is evil.
- E. You have to love the good AND hate the evil—love God AND hate the devil.
- IV. Most people interpret Ephesians 4:26-27 as "Don't go to bed angry. Get it worked out before going to sleep":

Let not the sun go down upon your wrath: [27] Neither give place to the devil.

- A. Although it's beneficial to do that, that's not what this verse is talking about.
- B. This verse is saying that you're supposed to have anger for the devil.
- C. The Lord gave you a capacity for anger, but it's not meant to be used toward other people—it's meant to be used toward the devil.
- D. Satan is just a squatter who will stick around in your life until you evict him.
- E. But don't just chase your Enemy over the hill; don't just fight until you get some relief and you can live with the rest.
- F. Pursue until you conquer—make it so your Enemy can never fight again.
- G. That's what Elijah did.

I. At that exact moment, this "sound of abundance of rain" was only in Elijah's heart:

And Elijah said unto Ahab, Get thee up, eat and drink; for there is a sound of abundance of rain.

1 KINGS 18:41

- A. There wasn't anything going on yet out in the physical realm.
- B. But Elijah saw it and heard it in his heart!
- II. Elijah didn't pray seven times—he only prayed once.

So Ahab went up to eat and to drink. And Elijah went up to the top of Carmel; and he cast himself down upon the earth, and put his face between his knees, [43] And said to his servant, Go up now, look toward the sea. And he went up, and looked, and said, There is nothing. And he said, Go again seven times. [44] And it came to pass at the seventh time, that he said, Behold, there ariseth a little cloud out of the sea, like a man's hand. And he said, Go up, say unto Ahab, Prepare thy chariot, and get thee down, that the rain stop thee not.

1 KINGS 18:42-44

A. Even though he sent his servant to go look seven times, he only prayed once.

Elias [Elijah] was a man subject to like passions as we are, and he prayed earnestly that it might not rain: and it rained not on the earth by the space of three years and six months. [18] And he prayed again, and the heaven gave rain, and the earth brought forth her fruit.

JAMES 5:17-18, BRACKETS MINE

- B. Sometimes people think it's wrong to pray about something more than once, but you ought to "pray without ceasing" (1 Thess. 5:17).
- C. I don't believe this scripture is saying to pray twenty-four hours a day.
- D. Praying without ceasing simply means not to stop praying until you see what you've prayed for manifest.
- E. Elijah kept praying—prayed without ceasing—until he saw the answer manifest; he became violently resolved.

III. Elijah had just mocked and killed 850 prophets of Baal, called down fire from heaven, and prayed and ended a three-year drought.

And it came to pass in the mean while, that the heaven was black with clouds and wind, and there was a great rain. And Ahab rode, and went to Jezreel. [46] And the hand of the LORD was on Elijah; and he girded up his loins [pulled up and tucked in his robe], and ran before Ahab to the entrance of Jezreel.

1 KINGS 18:45-46, BRACKETS MINE

- A. Elijah's adrenaline was pumping so hard that he outran a chariot twenty miles and beat Ahab to Jezreel.
- B. This was an awesome day in the life of Elijah!
- C. But let's look in chapter 19.

And Ahab told Jezebel all that Elijah had done, and withal how he had slain all the prophets with the sword. [2] Then Jezebel sent a messenger unto Elijah, saying, So let the gods do to me, and more also, if I make not thy life as the life of one of them by to morrow about this time.

1 KINGS 19:1-2

D. Upon hearing the news that her prophets had been killed, Jezebel became furious, took an oath saying, "May the gods make me like one of these slaughtered prophets if Elijah isn't dead by this time tomorrow!" and sent a messenger to tell him.

And when he [Elijah] saw that, he arose, and went [fled] for his life.

1 KINGS 19:3. BRACKETS MINE

- E. What did Elijah see?
- F. He had just killed 850 people—most usually tend to skim over this because it isn't real pleasant, but they need to stop and envision it.
- G. Think of the blood that Elijah must have been drenched in—what a graphic scene!

IV. So, what did Elijah see (1 Kin. 19:3)?

- A. He saw himself like one of those dead men he had just slaughtered.
- B. The day before, he had seen the word God had put in his heart.
- C. However, this same ability to see what God says on the inside can work in reverse.
- D. We can see both positive and negative things in our hearts.
- E. Elijah saw himself dead, which is why he fled.
- F. Although Jezebel desired to kill Elijah, she didn't have the power to do it.

- G. If Jezebel had truly intended to kill Elijah at that moment, she would have done so without warning him.
- H. In reality, Jezebel was trying to intimidate Elijah.
- I. Our greatest temptations will often come immediately after our greatest victories.
- V. Success is harder to handle than failure.
 - A. Although this is true, most people don't believe it.
 - B. They say, "What's really inside you comes out when you're squeezed," when actually, it's just the opposite—a person's true character is revealed in times of success.
 - C. Most people who have any commitment, any relationship with the Lord, will seek Him during hard times.
 - D. But where most people are destroyed is in prosperity.
 - E. We can tell more about a person's character in prosperity than we can in adversity.
 - F. When everything is going well, we tend not to be as God-dependent.
 - G. That's why we're the most vulnerable in the midst of prosperity: We tend to become more self-reliant when things are going well.
 - H. That is exactly what happened to Elijah.

I. If Elijah had really wanted to die, all he had to do was stay there and Jezebel would have obliged him.

And when he saw that, he arose, and went for his life, and came to Beersheba, which belongeth to Judah, and left his servant there. [4] But he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a juniper tree: and he requested for himself that he might die; and said, It is enough; now, O LORD, take away my life; for I am not better than my fathers.

1 KINGS 19:3-4

- A. This is the same for so many of us.
- B. We get into self-pity and say things like, "Nothing ever works for me. Things never turn out right!" but we know in our hearts that what we're saying isn't true.
- C. Elijah was praying "Take away my life," when the truth was that he didn't really want to die; he was in self-pity.
- D. Here is a revealing statement:

O LORD, take away my life; for I am not better than my fathers.

1 KINGS 19:4

- E. Elijah had just experienced an unbroken string of successes, so this was dangerous territory, and he started thinking he was better than his fathers.
- F. Elijah honestly thought that somehow or another, God was using him because of some superior ability, quality, or character in his life.
- G. He thought he was better than other people, and the moment you do that, you're headed for trouble!
- II. Elijah began by being God-dependent, by totally trusting and relying on God to do things through him.
 - A. But somewhere along the way, as he saw his successes, he actually moved his identity and confidence away from who he was in the Lord and what God had done in him, to who he was in himself and what he'd done.
 - B. It's easy to be God-dependent when you're struggling, things aren't going well, and there's nothing you can see in the natural to base your faith on.

- C. But when they start seeing success and things begin to work, many people move their confidence away from the Lord and what He has said, to things they can see.
- D. Then they believe they're a success because of the size of their church, the income of their ministry, the miracles they've seen, or something else.
- E. Elijah fell because he had transferred his faith and confidence from the Lord to himself.
- F. And this is true for every last one of us.
- G. Transferring our faith and confidence from God to ourselves is deadly.
- III. I'm amazed at how many people think that the longer we're with the Lord, the stronger and more anointed we become—somehow, we think that we're improving in the process.
 - A. The truth is the exact opposite.
 - B. If we're seeing a greater manifestation of God in our lives—greater joy, power, freedom, etc.—the truth is we're becoming more and more dependent on Him.
 - C. Even though we're more focused on God and can hear Him better, our flesh never improves.
 - D. And the moment we get out of the spirit and into the flesh, we are as capable of doing anything as that flesh was ever capable of doing!
 - E. The only victory you're experiencing is because you've become more and more God-dependent.
 - F. You've let Him live through you (Gal. 2:20).
 - G. The moment you quit letting God live through you by getting back into self-centeredness and self-sufficiency, you are as capable of doing anything as you ever were.
- IV. God is more concerned about you than He is about your ministry; He's more concerned about you than He is just using you.
 - A. God won't promote you if He knows you can't handle it—He knows you'll be destroyed.
 - B. God loves you!
 - C. Even though He may have given you a call and you can see what the vision is, there is a time in between the call, being separated to that call, and seeing the fulfillment of it.
 - D. You are the one, primarily, who dictates this amount of time based on what kind of character you develop on the inside.
 - E. This is what happened to Elijah—he never was better than his fathers!
 - F. As soon as Elijah started reading his own press releases, he became swelled up in pride.
 - G. He was headed for failure the moment he thought *I've done things nobody else has ever done. I'm special!* "Better than My Fathers"

[7] And the angel of the LORD came again the second time, and touched him, and said, Arise and eat; because the journey is too great for thee. - A. Elijah wasn't "there"; this wasn't where God wanted him to be.
- B. They were having a revival in Samaria, but the guy God used to spark it had fled.
- C. Instead of rejoicing and leading the people, Elijah was hiding and complaining.
- D. So, the Lord asked, "What are you doing here? This isn't there! This is not where I want you to be."

II. Look at Elijah's answer.

And he said, I have been very jealous for the LORD God of hosts: for the children of Israel have forsaken thy covenant, thrown down thine altars, and slain thy prophets with the sword; and I, even I only, am left; and they seek my life, to take it away.

1 KINGS 19:10

- A. Instead of humbling himself, he justified himself.
- B. Elijah was defeated, depressed, and in retreat, but he still wasn't willing to admit, "God, it's me. I missed it."
- C. Instead, he was contending, "It's other people and what they've done. I'm the only one left!"
- D. This attitude is prevalent in society today—very few people accept responsibility for themselves and their actions.
- E. They're always using some excuse.
- F. That's exactly what Elijah was doing.
- G. The Lord was giving him a test to see if he had repented, but he gave the wrong answer.
- H. Elijah was deceived.

- I. Never, under any circumstances, are you ever the only one who loves God.
- J. Anytime you think that, you're in big trouble!
- K. It's just never, ever true.

III. So, the Lord spoke to Elijah again.

And he said, Go forth, and stand upon the mount before the LORD. And, behold, the LORD passed by, and a great and strong wind rent the mountains, and brake in pieces the rocks before the LORD; but the LORD was not in the wind: and after the wind an earthquake; but the LORD was not in the earthquake: [12] And after the earthquake a fire; but the LORD was not in the fire: and after the fire a still small voice.

1 KINGS 19:11-12

- A. Elijah had started off just listening to the still, small voice and having relationship with God.
- B. He was a nobody—nothing dramatic had ever happened.
- C. Then the Lord had spoken a word into his heart concerning a drought, and the ball started rolling.
- D. Yet later on, Elijah had seen God do so many powerful things through him that he'd moved away from the simple and gotten into the spectacular.
- E. He had moved away from being intimate with and completely dependent on God.
- F. I've met many ministers who have seen God use them in great manifestations of His power, but after a while, that little zing, that emotional high they get from being somebody special, wears off.
- G. Then they have to do something else to become someone special again.
- H. It's easy to transfer your dependence and faith away from God and onto things.
- I. The Lord was calling Elijah back to humility and intimate relationship.
- J. He was saying, "Elijah, you've gotten away from this. This was what made you who you are. It's what made the things you've seen happen. Yet you've gotten away from them."

- IV. When Elijah first started his ministry, he had nothing in the natural going for him—except he had a word from God.
 - A. Then he became a success.
 - B. He moved away from the simplicity of his relationship with the Lord—he left his first love (Rev. 2:4).
 - C. The Lord did all those dramatic things (1 Kings 19:11-12), but He wasn't in them; He was in the still, small voice.
 - D. You'll never grow beyond this—you'll never grow beyond just this personal, intimate relationship with God.
 - E. This must be the foundation of anyone who is going to stay with God over a prolonged period of time.
 - F. In 1 Kings 19:13, the Lord finally spoke to him in a still, small voice, asking again, "What are you doing here, Elijah?"
 - G. It's pretty serious when God repeats Himself.
 - H. Elijah failed the first time, so God let him take the test over again by asking the same question.
 - I. However, Elijah answered with the same exact words!

And he said, I have been very jealous for the LORD God of hosts: because the children of Israel have forsaken thy covenant, thrown down thine altars, and slain thy prophets with the sword; and I, even I only, am left; and they seek my life, to take it away.

1 KINGS 19:14

- J. If the Lord lets you retake a test, it's because you failed the first time around.
- K. Elijah should have at least tried a different answer.
- L. The Lord finally went on and said, "There are 7,000 who haven't bowed the knee to Baal" (1 Kin. 19:18).
- M. Anytime you think you're the only person with a revelation or who's doing something, you're wrong!
- N. You've moved into some form of pride and arrogance, thinking that you have something nobody else has—it's never true.
- V. The Lord then told Elijah to do three things.

- A. One was to get a replacement—to find Elisha—and anoint him to be prophet in his stead.
- B. Personally, I don't believe Elisha was God's original plan.
- C. David wasn't God's first choice either.

And Samuel said to Saul, Thou hast done foolishly: thou hast not kept the commandment of the LORD thy God, which he commanded thee: for now would the LORD have established thy kingdom upon Israel for ever. Be Gaithful!

fter Elijah anointed Elisha, he didn't do very much. This was basically the end of his ministry. Elijah never anointed the two kings God had commanded him to anoint.

What Ahab did to Naboth was totally unjust. He wanted Naboth's vineyard, but Naboth wouldn't sell. So, Jezebel and Ahab set him up and brought false charges against him. After Jezebel had Naboth stoned, she told Ahab to go down and possess his vineyard (1 Kin. 21).

If Elijah had been obedient to anoint Jehu as king, Ahab and Jezebel wouldn't have done this. When Elisha did finally anoint him, Jehu marched right out of the room, rode straight into Samaria, and immediately killed Ahaziah, Jezebel, and all of Ahab's relatives (2 Kin. 9-10). Ahab himself had already died in battle some time before (1 Kin. 22:34-40). As Jehu took over the kingdom, he deceived all of the nation's Baal worshipers into gathering together at once in the house of Baal. Then he closed the gates and ordered his army to kill every single one of them. Jehu made the house of Baal a latrine (2 Kin. 10:27). He was vicious!

If Elijah had anointed Jehu as king, Ahab and Jezebel would have been dead and Naboth would never have been killed. The death of Naboth was actually a result of Elijah failing to do what God told him to do. Therefore, Elijah was responsible for Naboth's death.

Since the Scripture doesn't tell us exactly what would have or could have happened, it's not productive to speculate. However, we do know that people—both individuals and the nation as a whole—suffered because of Elijah's disobedience. Elisha was actually a second thought. All of this would probably have never happened if Elijah had fulfilled his ministry.

CALLED BY GRACE

I've heard many people testify that they weren't God's first choice for the assignment He called them to do. You may not be God's first choice either. You may be picking up a mantle that someone else laid down. You may say, "But, Andrew, that's hard on my pride!" Good!

You need to recognize that God has never had anybody qualified working for Him yet. The Lord isn't using you because you're so perfect and holy and you have it all together. If you keep this in mind, it'll prevent you from getting this "Elijah Syndrome" and slipping into this attitude of "I'm the only one!"

God uses you because you're available, responsive, and fully trusting in Him. But the moment you think the Lord is using you because of who you are and what you've done, you're headed for trouble (Prov. 16:18). God could easily raise up somebody else to do it instead. Although He calls you based on His grace, whether or not the Lord promotes you any further does depend on how you respond to certain things.

If Elijah had humbled himself when God tested him, I believe the Lord would have restored him. Then Elijah could have fulfilled his call in life. But since he continued in arrogance, Elijah missed most of the rest of God's plan.

STAY HUMBLE

God loves us and it's by His grace that He's called any of us to minister. It's His grace that has given us whatever gifts we have. Our gifts and callings are by grace. They aren't based on our performance (Rom. 11:29). But as far as our God-given spheres of influence, those are dependent on a lot of things.

If you've proven to be a person without character, the Lord won't promote you. That doesn't mean you can't be promoted. There is a religious system today that can promote people itself. Some folks who make it to the "top," get on radio and television, become famous, but were not put there by God at all. The Lord doesn't promote someone who isn't going to accurately represent Him.

If you fall into this "Elijah Syndrome" and flunk your test, humble yourself and learn from your mistake. If God gives you a retest and you continue in your arrogance, you could actually decrease your influence and cut your ministry short. Faithfulness is important!

God rewards faithfulness. He has a perfect plan for every single one of us, totally independent of our performance. However, our ability to experience and fulfill those plans will depend on how closely we follow the Lord and stay humble before Him.

Elijah was a man who did all these great things. Then he also failed—big time! When God spoke to him in an audible voice, he refused to do two-thirds of what God had commanded him to do. Yet Elijah walked with God to such a degree that he was translated into heaven. He was one of only two people who never died (2 Kin. 2:11 and Heb. 11:5). Talk about grace!

KNOW YOUR PLACE

Basically, Elijah never fulfilled his ministry. He didn't do everything God told him to do. He quit midstream because he failed. Elijah was just never able to recover and get back on track, because his confidence was in himself. Yet he walked with God to such a degree that he was translated:

And it came to pass, when the LORD would take up Elijah into heaven by a whirlwind, that Elijah went with Elisha from Gilgal. [2] And Elijah said unto Elisha, Tarry here, I pray thee; for the LORD hath sent me to Bethel. And Elisha said unto him, As the LORD liveth, and as thy soul liveth, I will not leave thee. So they went down to Bethel.

2 KINGS 2:1-2

And Elijah said unto him, Elisha, tarry here, I pray thee; for the LORD hath sent me to Jericho. And he said, As the LORD liveth, and as thy soul liveth, I will not leave thee. So they came to Jericho.

2 KINGS 2:4

And Elijah said unto him, Tarry, I pray thee, here: for the LORD hath sent me to Jordan. And he said, As the LORD liveth, and as thy soul liveth, I will not leave thee. And they two went on.

2 KINGS 2:6

Elijah tried to part with Elisha three different times, but Elisha just held on. Elisha had this concept that Elijah possessed in the beginning: He was going to be where God wanted him to be. He was going to be "there!" Elisha knew what was going to happen to Elijah, and he refused to stay "here"; he went "there." He knew his place was with Elijah, not somewhere else. Therefore, he wouldn't take no for an answer. Elisha was a faithful guy!

FULLY DEPENDENT ON HIM

Elisha was never rebuked the way Elijah was. We didn't see the failure in Elisha's life the way we saw it in Elijah's. Elisha performed twice as many miracles, yet he wasn't translated. He died. In fact, the Scripture records that he died sick.

Now Elisha was fallen sick of his sickness whereof he died... [20] And Elisha died, and they buried him. And the bands of the Moabites invaded the land at the coming in of the year. [21] And it came to pass, as they were burying a man, that, behold, they spied a band of men; and they cast the man into the sepulchre of Elisha: and when the man was let down, and touched the bones of Elisha, he revived, and stood up on his feet.

2 KINGS 13:14 AND 20-21

Even though Elisha died of sickness, the power of God operated so strongly in him that a dead man came back to life after merely touching his bones! I don't understand how there was enough anointing in Elisha's bones to raise the dead yet he died of sickness. I also don't understand how Elisha could be more faithful than Elijah yet not have the same results. Why wasn't he translated too? Apparently, there were other variables that we're not aware of.

There is much to learn from the life of Elijah! When you begin to see success and start feeling like you've done something, you'd better draw near to God and keep your full dependence on Him. If you swell up in pride, you'll be headed for a fall (Prov. 16:18). Recognize that you aren't the only one preaching the Word, ministering in power, and doing something to advance God's kingdom. You need to maintain a humble attitude. If you do, the Lord will be able to preserve you from the kinds of problems you saw in the life of Elijah (1 Pet. 5:5-6).

[11] And the men of his city, even the elders and the nobles who were the inhabitants in his city, did as Jezebel had sent unto them, and as it was written in the letters which she had sent unto them. [12] They proclaimed a fast, and set Naboth on high among the people. [13] And there came in two men, children of Belial, and sat before him: and the men of Belial witnessed against him, even against Naboth, in the presence of the people, saying, Naboth did blaspheme God and the king. Then they carried him forth out of the city, and stoned him with stones, that he died. [14] Then they sent to Jezebel, saying, Naboth is stoned, and is dead. [15] And it came to pass, when Jezebel heard that Naboth was stoned, and was dead, that Jezebel said to Ahab, Arise, take possession of the vineyard of Naboth the Jezreelite, which he refused to give thee for money: for Naboth is not alive, but dead. [16] And it came to pass, when Ahab heard that Naboth was dead, that Ahab rose up to go down to the vineyard of Naboth the Jezreelite, to take possession of it. [17] And the word of the LORD came to Elijah the Tishbite, saying, [18] Arise, go down to meet Ahab king of Israel, which is in Samaria: behold, he is in the vineyard of *Naboth, whither he is gone down to possess it.* [19] *And thou shalt speak unto him,* saying, Thus saith the LORD, Hast thou killed, and also taken possession? And thou shalt speak unto him, saying, Thus saith the LORD, In the place where dogs licked the blood of Naboth shall dogs lick thy blood, even thine. [20] And Ahab said to Elijah, Hast thou found me, O mine enemy? And he answered, I have found thee: because thou hast sold thyself to work evil in the sight of the LORD. [21] Behold, I will bring evil upon thee, and will take away thy posterity, and will cut off from Ahab him that pisseth against the wall, and him that is shut up and left in Israel, [22] And will make thine house like the house of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, and like the house of Baasha the son of Ahijah, for the provocation wherewith thou hast provoked me to anger, and made Israel to sin. [23] And of Jezebel also spake the LORD, saying, The dogs shall eat Jezebel by the wall of Jezreel. [24] Him that dieth of Ahab in the city the dogs shall eat; and him that dieth in the field shall the fowls of the air eat.

LUKE 9:54-56

And when his disciples James and John saw this, they said, Lord, wilt thou that we command fire to come down from heaven, and consume them, even as Elias did? [55] But he turned, and rebuked them, and said, Ye know not what manner of spirit ye are of. [56] For the Son of man is not come to destroy men's lives, but to save them. And they went to another village.



- I. What Ahab did to Naboth was totally unjust.
 - A. If Elijah had been obedient to anoint Jehu as king, Ahab and Jezebel wouldn't have falsely accused Naboth, killed him, and stolen his land (1 Kin. 21).
 - B. When Elisha did finally anoint him, Jehu marched right out of the room, rode straight into Samaria, and immediately killed Ahaziah, Jezebel, and all of Ahab's relatives (2 Kin. 9-10).
 - C. If Elijah had anointed Jehu as king, Ahab and Jezebel would have been dead and Naboth would never have been killed.
 - D. The death of Naboth was actually a result of Elijah failing to do what God told him to do.
 - E. Since the Scripture doesn't tell us exactly what would have or could have happened, it's not productive to speculate.
 - F. However, we do know that people—both individuals and the nation as a whole—suffered because of Elijah's disobedience.
 - G. All of this would probably have never happened if Elijah had fulfilled his ministry.
- II. You need to recognize that God has never had anybody qualified working for Him yet.
 - A. The Lord isn't using you because you're so perfect and holy and you have it all together.
 - B. If you keep this in mind, it'll prevent you from getting this "Elijah Syndrome" and slipping into this attitude of "I'm the only one!"
 - C. God uses you because you're available, responsive, and fully trusting in Him.
 - D. But the moment you think the Lord is using you because of who you are and what you've done, you're headed for trouble (Prov. 16:18).
 - E. God could easily raise up somebody else to do it instead.
 - F. Although He calls you based on His grace, whether or not the Lord promotes you any further does depend on how you respond to certain things.
 - G. If Elijah had humbled himself when God tested him, I believe the Lord would have restored him—then Elijah could have fulfilled his call in life.
- III. God loves us and it's by His grace that He's called any of us to minister.
 - A. Our gifts and callings are by grace; they aren't based on our performance (Rom. 11:29).
 - B. But as far as our God-given spheres of influence, those are dependent on a lot of things.
 - C. If we've proven to be people without character, the Lord won't promote us.
 - D. That doesn't mean we can't be promoted.
 - E. There is a religious system today that can promote people itself.

- F. But the Lord doesn't promote someone who isn't going to accurately represent Him.
- G. If we fall into this "Elijah Syndrome" and flunk our test, we should humble ourselves and learn from our mistakes.
- H. Faithfulness is important!
- I. God rewards faithfulness.
- J. He has a perfect plan for every single one of us, totally independent of our performance.
- K. However, our ability to experience and fulfill those plans will depend on how closely we follow the Lord and stay humble before Him.
- IV. Basically, Elijah never fulfilled his ministry.
 - A. He quit midstream because he failed.
 - B. Elijah was just never able to recover and get back on track, because his confidence was in himself.
 - C. Yet he walked with God to such a degree that he was translated:

And it came to pass, when the LORD would take up Elijah into heaven by a whirlwind, that Elijah went with Elisha from Gilgal. [2] And Elijah said unto Elisha, Tarry here, I pray thee; for the LORD hath sent me to Bethel. And Elisha said unto him, As the LORD liveth, and as thy soul liveth, I will not leave thee. So they went down to Bethel.

2 KINGS 2:1-2

And Elijah said unto him, Elisha, tarry here, I pray thee; for the LORD hath sent me to Jericho. And he said, As the LORD liveth, and as thy soul liveth, I will not leave thee. So they came to Jericho.

2 KINGS 2:4

And Elijah said unto him, Tarry, I pray thee, here: for the LORD hath sent me to Jordan. And he said, As the LORD liveth, and as thy soul liveth, I will not leave thee. And they two went on.

2 KINGS 2:6

- D. Elijah tried to part with Elisha three different times, but Elisha just held on.
- E. Elisha had this concept that Elijah possessed in the beginning: He was going to be where God wanted him to be—he was going to be "there!"
- F. He knew his place was with Elijah, not somewhere else; therefore, he wouldn't take no for an answer.
- G. Elisha was a faithful guy!

- V. Elisha was never rebuked the way Elijah was, nor did we see the failure in Elisha's life the way we saw it in Elijah's.
 - A. Elisha performed twice as many miracles, yet he wasn't translated—he died.
 - B. In fact, the Scripture records that he died sick.

Now Elisha was fallen sick of his sickness whereof he died.... [20] And Elisha died, and they buried him. And the bands of the Moabites invaded the land at the coming in of the year. [21] And it came to pass, as they were burying a man, that, behold, they spied a band of men; and they cast the man into the sepulchre of Elisha: and when the man was let down, and touched the bones of Elisha, he revived, and stood up on his feet.

2 KINGS 13:14 AND 20-21

- C. Even though Elisha died of sickness, the power of God operated so strongly in him that a dead man came back to life after merely touching his bones!
- D. I don't understand how there was enough anointing in Elisha's bones to raise the dead yet he died of sickness.
- E. I also don't understand how Elisha could be more faithful than Elijah yet not have the same results—why wasn't he translated too?
- F. Apparently, there were other variables that we're not aware of.

VI. There is much to learn from the life of Elijah!

- A. When you begin to see success and start feeling like you've done something, you'd better draw near to God and keep your full dependence on Him.
- B. If you swell up in pride, you'll be headed for a fall (Prov. 16:18).
- C. Recognize that you aren't the only one preaching the Word, ministering in power, and doing something to advance God's kingdom.
- D. You need to maintain a humble attitude.
- E. If you do, the Lord will be able to preserve you from the kinds of problems you saw in the life of Elijah (1 Pet. 5:5-6).
