The LORD shall open unto thee his good treasure, the heaven to give the rain unto thy land in his season, and to bless all the work of thine hand: and thou shalt lend unto many nations, and thou shalt not borrow.

Deuteronomy 28:12

- A. If you pay for a house on credit, you're going to pay for that thing at least twice—perhaps three times.
- B. Instead of doing things God's way concerning lending and not borrowing, the average American just goes into debt.
- C. If that's you, there's no condemnation.
- D. As long as you can tolerate living in debt, you'll never get out of it.
- E. If you're in this position, don't feel bad about it or get discouraged over it.

- G. Are we going to just keep running after the so-called "American dream" where we get all we can, can all we get, and then sit on our can?
- H. There's something better—God's best—but that isn't even a goal for most people.
- III. What's happening on a national level here in America is people are digging themselves into a huge hole.
  - A. Neither governments nor individuals can perpetually live this way; sooner or later, debt catches up with them.
  - B. Everyone who holds a debt mindset is part of the problem.

- I. For Asa, seeking the physicians was not the same as seeking the Lord (2 Chr. 16:11-12).
  - A. Many of us today do the same.
  - B. Culturally, we've developed this mindset that the very first thing we should do when facing sickness is go to the physicians, depend on medicine, and submit to surgery.
  - C. Seeking God is our last thought—if we even think of it at all.
  - D. Many people think that God and physicians are equal; they aren't.
  - E. We ought to rely on physicians only if we've prayed and the Lord has led us that way.
  - F. Many people's default is to go through all of man's ways and resources first and turn to God *only* when the situation gets beyond human ability.
  - G. Asa depended upon man's strength and ability.
  - H. It's another indication of how he kept doing things in his own might instead of depending on God.
  - I. Friends, we need to learn how to depend on God, even for our health.
  - J. Many people today just take whatever others shove at them: a pill to get up and a pill to go to bed; they have a pill for everything!
  - K. They rely on the flesh and then wonder why they aren't receiving God's best.
- II. Doctors are fighting sickness, but it's just through human ability.
  - A. Some of what doctors do is good, and some of it's bad.
  - B. There's a reason why they have the highest malpractice insurance in the world.
  - C. Doctors make mistakes, but people think doctors are infallible.
  - D. If the Lord tarries, people will look back on our day a hundred years from

now and shake their heads at the way cancer is currently being treated.

- I. When it comes to love, we've been lied to by the world.
  - A. First Corinthians 13 reveals to us that God's kind of love "suffereth long, and is kind" (1 Cor. 13:4).
  - B. Many of us as Christians have a million excuses for why we don't suffer long and aren't kind.
  - C. Well, we can be delivered of that!
  - D. If we were to operate in God's kind of love, we would suffer long and be kind; we would not be critical, angry, or bitter.
  - E. "Charity [God's kind of love] envieth not" (1 Cor. 13:4, brackets mine), but are we jealous of other people?
  - F. Love "vaunteth not itself, is not puffed up" (1 Cor. 13:4), and love is not self-centered or self-promoting.
  - G. If we're around somebody who's bragging about everything they've done, do we feel compelled to boast so that we'll look good in comparison, so that they'll know we're somebody special too?
  - H. Many people toot their own horns.
  - I. But Proverbs 27:1-2 says:

Boast not thyself of to morrow; for thou knowest not what a day may bring forth. [2] Let another man praise thee, and not thine own mouth; a stranger, and not thine own lips.

- II. God's kind of love is self-controlled and acts properly; it "doth not behave itself unseemly" (1 Cor. 13:5).
  - A. When a person says, "Oh, we're in love. We can't wait until we're married. Let's go ahead and have sex because we're just so in love," that's not God's kind of love.
  - B. If someone can't control themselves, they are not displaying God's kind of love (Gal. 5:22-23).

- C. Love was when Jesus hung on the cross (Rom. 5:8).
- D. If you're going to abuse, hurt, and take advantage of another person, it's not love; it's lust.
- III. Love "seeketh not her own" (1 Cor. 13:5).
  - A. Many people today are selfish and self-centered.
  - B. I heard someone say that America is no longer a society; we're all individuals.
  - C. There's no longer a society where we get along and cooperate with one another; now it's all about "my rights."
- IV. Most of what we're looking at right now in our study together may be totally new to you, or if you've heard this before, you might have rejected it and thought, *I've got to put myself first*.
  - A. And then you wonder why you aren't receiving God's best.
  - B. You're resisting God and have submitted to the flesh.
  - C. It's supposed to be the other way around: submit to God, and resist the world, the flesh, and the devil (James 4:7).
- V. God's kind of love never fails:

[Charity] is not easily provoked, thinketh no evil; [6] Rejoiceth not in iniquity, but rejoiceth in the truth; [7] Beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things. [8] Charity never faileth.

1 Corinthians 13:5b-8a, brackets mine

- A. Yet there are people today saying, "I've taken all I can take. I can't bear anymore. I can't believe that things are going to work out anymore. I've lost my hope. I can't endure anymore."
- B. All they've done is admit that they aren't operating in God's kind of love.
- C. His love flowing to and through us can bear all things, believe all things, hope all things, and endure all things.

### Living in God's Best

- VI. Most of us haven't even set walking in God's kind of love as a goal.

- B. These four lepers basically asked themselves, "How long are we going to sit here? Until we die?"
- C. Maybe you're not content where you are, but you aren't doing anything about it because you're afraid that it might not work out.

#### ANDREW'S RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FURTHER STUDY

The Lord spoke to me on January 31, 2002, and told me that I was limiting Him by my small thinking. ### Outline

- I. If you need to be healed, you don't have to pray and ask God to heal you; what you need to do is learn how to receive the healing that has already been provided.
  - A To think that you need to go and get God to do something that He hasn't yet done has an element of doubt in it, because you don't know whether He will act on your behalf or not.
  - B. If He's already provided it by grace (and in Christ, He has), then you just need to believe and receive it by faith.
  - C. Some people say, "Oh, I believe God's going to heal me," but actually, it's unbelief.
  - D. According to 1 Peter 2:24, it's not in the future that you're going to be healed; it's in the past that you *were* healed.
- II. It's much easier to release something that you've already got than it is to go get something that you don't yet have.
  - A. This is a major shift of mindset!
  - B. You're looking at how to *receive* God's best—not how to *convince* God to give you His best.
  - C. Consider how the Apostle Paul prayed:

Wherefore I also, after I heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus, and love unto all the saints, [16] Cease not to give thanks for you, making mention of you in my prayers; [17] That the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give unto you the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of him.

Ephesians 1:15-17

- D. The Holy Spirit inspired him to pray, "God, open up their eyes to what You've already done."
- E. Most Christians believe God can do anything but that He has done nothing.
- F. They think that if they do everything just right, God might move.

- III. God anticipated every problem that we or anybody else in the entire human race would ever have.
  - A. Through Christ's death, burial, and resurrection, He dealt with every problem that could ever happen—past, present, and future.
  - B. Now it's up to us to receive what He's done by putting faith in what is already provided, not in what God "can" do.
  - C. Holy Spirit, please grant us revelation knowledge concerning the truths in this lesson.

#### IV. Ephesians 1:18 says,

The eyes of your understanding being enlightened; that ye may know what is the hope of his calling.

- A. It's not about our calling; it's Jesus's calling.
- B. Jesus has already been called, and He's already provided everything.
- C. He paid the price for everything on the cross, and He has the favor of God now.
- D. As born-again believers, we have favor with God because of what Jesus did, not because of what we do.
- E. It's about His calling, His anointing, His power, and His blessing that's on our lives.
- V. Paul was praying that our eyes would be opened to understand and see "what is the hope of his calling, and what the riches of the glory of his inheritance in the saints" (Eph. 1:18).
  - A. It would bankrupt heaven to have to replace what we already have on the inside of us right now.
  - B. The glory of God is in us!
  - C. Some people want to see a "glory cloud."
  - D. We need to look on the inside!

- E. If we can't see it, it's because we're walking by sight and not by faith (2 Cor. 5:7).
- F. We have been called "to the obtaining of the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ" (2 Thess. 2:14).
- G. In heaven, we'll get bodies that will reflect His glory, but right now, we have the glory of God on the inside of us.
- VI. Paul prayed that we would see the exceeding greatness of His power "to us-ward who believe" (Eph. 1:19)—the same power God used when He raised Christ from the dead.
  - A. Yet most of us as Christians think we have to beg God and somehow get Him to release His power.
  - B. We may believe that, somehow or another, all the glory and blessings of God are reserved for heaven, and in this life, we just have to hang on and struggle through.
  - C. Many of us believe that we have to be sick, poor, and up and down like a yo-yo.
  - D. John the Baptist, referring to Isaiah's prophecy, declared that "every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be brought low; and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough ways shall be made smooth" (Luke 3:5, see also Is. 40:4).
  - E. This means that there should be increasingly smooth sailing.

#### VII. You ought to be consistent.

- A. The number one way that people describe me when they are introducing me is to say, "He's exactly the same as he is on television."
- B. You shouldn't be one person in front of an audience and another when you're not.
- C. If you're normally a really quiet person and then you just explode and become this other person when you get behind a pulpit, it could be because you're a hypocrite and religious.
- D. You should be the same all the time, because if you're walking with Jesus, He's "the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever" (Heb. 13:8).

- E. If you're up sometimes and down other times, it's because sometimes you're trusting in Jesus, and other times you're walking in your own flesh.
- F. You ought to be supernaturally natural.
- G. The same power that raised Christ from the dead is in you at all times (Eph. 1:19-20); it never fluctuates.

VIII. We need to find out who we are and what we have in Christ.

- A. Many of us as Christians don't live as if we have on the inside of us the same power that raised Jesus from the dead, because we can't feel it.
- B. Looking in the mirror, it doesn't appear like we have the same power that raised Jesus from the dead.
- C. And since we can't feel anything, we don't believe that God has done anything.
- D. It's not up to God whether or not we walk in it; it's up to us.
- IX. You could stand the average Christian up next to an unbeliever and find that they have the same fears, the same financial problems, and the same struggles.
  - A. They act just like people who don't know God, who don't have a covenant that says, "My God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus" (Phil. 4:19).
  - B. Do you have the same fears as someone who doesn't know God?
  - C. If so, something is wrong with this picture.
  - D. You're alive, and they're dead (spiritually).
  - E. It's not because God hasn't given; it's because you don't know what you have.
- X. If God could be confused, He would be.
  - A. Imagine if He looked over at Jesus and said, "Didn't You tell them that by Your stripes they were healed (1 Pet. 2:24)? Why are they asking Me to heal them? Didn't You tell them they're blessed with all spiritual blessings (Eph. 1:3), that

You became poor so that through Your poverty they could be made rich (2 Cor. 8:9)? Didn't You tell them that I would supply all of their needs according to My riches in glory—not according to the economy of their country (Phil. 4:19)? Didn't You tell them that? Why are they panicking because it's the 'Great Recession'? Why are they anxious, fearful, and worried?"

- B. It's because we don't believe that God has already done it.
- C. We're thinking that it's up to God to give and not up to us to receive.

#### XI. It's our receivers that are messed up, not God's transmitter!

- A. If we were watching television and all of a sudden the set turned off, the first thing we'd probably do is look to see if someone unplugged it.
- B. Then we'd troubleshoot and see if something was wrong with the set.
- C. We wouldn't just get up and call the television station, asking, "Why did you quit broadcasting?"
- D. If we pray and don't receive something immediately, we think, *Lord*, *why didn't You give it?*
- E. It's never God who doesn't give; it's us who quit receiving.
- F. We just need to tune in our receivers and pray, "O Lord, help me to see and understand what You've already done!"

XII. Believing that God has already done His part is 90 percent of the battle; then there are certain things that we must do.

- A. We need to quit doubting God and just believe, praying, "I know You've done it. If I'm not seeing the answer manifest, it's not Your fault. You've already supplied. Thank You, Lord!"
- B. Then we need to start praising God in faith, saying, "I don't know why I can't see it, but I know You're not the problem. I just want to praise You for being so faithful. Even though I'm sick and the doctor says I'm going to die, it's not Your fault. You didn't do this to me. Thank You for being a good God!"
- C. We need to praise and thank Him, and we'll get out of that fear, worry, griping, and complaining.

- D. Let's stop murmuring and doubting God and start praising Him.
- E. Many people receive healing through aggressively acknowledging, by their thanks and praise, what the Lord has already done, and we can too!

Every valley shall be exalted, and every mountain and hill shall be made low: and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough places plain.

#### HEBREWS 13:8

Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever.

#### PHILIPPIANS 4:19

But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus.

#### **EPHESIANS 1:3**

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who hath blessed us with all spiritual blessings in heavenly places in Christ.

For ye know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that, though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, that ye through his poverty might be rich.

### Outline

- I. John 4:24 says, "God is a Spirit: and they that worship him must worship him in spirit and in truth."
  - A. God moves in the spirit realm before something manifests in the physical realm; there's a process.
  - B. From the time God moves and commands, there are things that have to take place, and sometimes that takes time.
  - C. In Daniel 9, God spoke and it took about three minutes for the answer (Gabriel) to show up (Dan. 9:20-23).
  - D. Then in chapter 10, God spoke and it took three weeks for Daniel to receive the answer (Dan. 10:12-14).
  - E. God wasn't the variable in these two instances; a demonic power withstood God's power the second time.
  - F. When you pray, there may be a period of time in between your "amen" and when the answer shows up.
  - G. Demonic powers or your doubt could be delaying your answer, or sometimes even other people are involved in answers to prayers.
  - H. You can't microwave your ministry.
  - I. Mark 4:28 says, "For the earth bringeth forth fruit of herself; first the blade, then the ear, after that the full corn in the ear."
  - J. There's a growth process in the things of the Lord, but some people just ignore this.
  - K. They pray, and if they don't see immediate results, they think, Well, God, You didn't answer my prayer, and they move into unbelief.
- II. You have to get to a place where you're practicing Mark 11:24: "What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them."
  - A. For instance, let's say that you have a pain in your body.

LESSON 7

- B. You say, "God, I pray and believe that I am healed," but you still feel pain.
- C. Many people will think, Well, God didn't do anything.
- D. That's because they don't understand that there are things taking place in the spirit realm.
- E. Jesus spoke to a fig tree, cursing it and saying, "No man eat fruit of thee hereafter for ever" (Mark 11:14).
- F. If someone had gone up and looked at that fig tree immediately, it wouldn't have reflected that a single thing happened.
- G. What would have happened if Jesus had thought, Well, I cursed the fig tree and it still looks fine; the leaves are still good?
- H. If He had gotten into unbelief, it would have stopped the power of God.
- I. But of course, Jesus spoke and knew His words would be accomplished, even though it didn't look like it was true.
- J. It just took a brief period of time for what had happened below the surface, out of sight, to become manifest in those physical leaves.
- K. You have to believe that you receive at that exact moment and that God has touched your body.
- L. Whether you still have pain, whether you look better, whether you feel better—anything—you just believe, saying, "I've got it right now, and it's manifesting because I've got it. It's a done deal!"
- III. Many people are what the Bible calls *carnal*.
  - A. We often think of being carnal as being ungodly, demonic, and terrible, but it simply means to be of the flesh or dominated by the senses.
  - B. So, carnal doesn't always refer to some terrible, ungodly God hater.
  - C. A person could love the Lord with their whole heart and still be carnal if they are controlled by their physical senses, if they just can't believe that anything exists that they can't see, taste, hear, smell, or feel.
  - D. Carnal-mindedness equals death:

For to be carnally minded is death; but to be spiritually minded is life and peace.

Romans 8:6

- E. It doesn't tend toward death, it's not a leading cause of death, and it doesn't produce death in some people—carnal-mindedness *is* death.
- IV. People don't have to be present when you sow seed in your garden in order for them to know what you've planted.
  - A. Just let them be there when something sprouts up.
  - B. They will be able to tell what you planted because it will be there growing and bearing fruit.
  - C. When people list all of the negative things they have growing in their lives, others can tell what they *haven't* been doing:
    - 1. They haven't been seeing who they are in Christ.
    - 2. They haven't taken their authority.
    - 3. They don't believe that it's already been done.
    - 4. They beg God out of desperation to "please move," but they don't believe that He's already given them power.
    - 5. They aren't standing their ground and resisting the devil!
- V. If you're being dominated and controlled by the devil, you haven't resisted him:

Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.

James 4:7

- A. The word *resist* means to actively fight against.
- B. You may have begged for help; you may be pitiful and desire help, but you haven't taken your authority in Christ and fought against Satan in the power and name of the Lord.
- C. You haven't taken Ephesians 1:19-20 and said, "I've got the same power

living on the inside of me that raised Jesus Christ from the dead."

- VI. God's eyes are going to and fro throughout the whole earth just looking for somebody to bless (2 Chr. 16:9).
  - A. He wants to bless us more than we want to be blessed, but we're carnally minded, dominated by sense knowledge.
  - B. What's normal for a born-again believer, according to the Word, is to walk by faith and not by sight (2 Cor. 5:7).
  - C. We need to get to where what God says to us is more real than what our bodies say, what the doctor says, what the banker says, what the people on the news say, or what the government says.
  - D. We need to get to where God's Word is the absolute, final authority, and if anyone or anything opposes it, they're wrong.
- VII. It's easy to say God's Word is first place when reading an inspirational book; but if you go to work and people start ragging on you, talking bad about everything that stands for good, and countering everything moral, would you fold like a two-dollar suitcase?
  - A. Or would you stand up and speak the truth in love?
  - B. Many Christians need to rise to their feet and get to where they believe, act on, and speak the Word of God.
  - C. It ought to be the unbelievers who feel embarrassed instead of Christians.
  - D. Instead of you feeling weird, the people who don't believe in God ought to feel weird.
  - E. Psalm 14:1 and 53:1 say the same thing: "The fool hath said in his heart, There is no God."
- VIII.If you say, "I just don't believe anything that I can't see, taste, hear, smell, or feel," then all that means is that you aren't very smart.
  - A. There are radio and television signals right there in the room where you are, but you can't see them.

- B. If you had a radio or television set, and you plugged it in, turned it on, and tuned it in, you could perceive those signals.
- C. Now, when you see and hear signals is not when they started; they were already there.
- D. In the spiritual realm, there are angels right there with you; God is there, and His glory is there.
- E. The same power that raised Jesus Christ from the dead is not just out in heaven someplace; it's on the inside of every born-again believer, but how do you access it?

By whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand.

Romans 5:2

- F. According to *Strong's Concordance*, the Greek word translated *access* here literally means "admission."
- G. The way you gain admission to the grace of God is through faith.
- IX. Faith is believing that something exists beyond your carnal ability to perceive:

So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.

Romans 10:17

The words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life.

John 6:63

- A. If you want to know what's going on in the spirit realm, you have to go to the Word of God.
- B. God's Word is a window into the spirit world.
- C. When you ask "Lord, what have You done for me?" look at His Word.
- D. When God's Word is more real to you than anything carnal, then the things that you believe will come to pass.
- E. You don't get to this place by being carnal and constantly feeding your five senses; you're going to have to spend time in the presence of the Lord; you're

- going to have to renew your mind, talk to Somebody you can't *see*, listen to Somebody you can't *hear*, and learn to operate in the supernatural realm.
- F. You do need to hear the preaching of the Word on a regular basis, but eventually you're also going to have to go directly to God yourself.
- X. In the same way that what God has provided in the spirit realm has to be accessed by faith, a curse has to be accessed by faith too.
  - A. This is called *unbelief*.
  - B. Unbelief is nothing but faith in the wrong thing.
  - C. If Satan comes against you—including with a curse—you have to put faith in that in order for it come to pass in your life.
  - D. You're the one who empowers the devil.
  - E. Faith works.

### Outline

- I. When people say the name of some sickness or disease, like cancer, it strikes fear in their hearts.
  - A. Many people are more moved by what the doctor, banker, or somebody else says than they are by what God's Word says, and that's the problem; they're empowering that curse and those negative things that have been spoken.
  - B. I could have believed what was said about the Great Recession back in 2007-2009 and pulled back, but I was listening to God, and He told me to do something else instead.
  - C. Although this is simple, it's not easy.
  - D. The hardest thing you'll ever do is get to where the Word of God—what you hear from Him, the truth He speaks to you in your heart—is more real to you than what anything or anyone else says.
- II. Satan can't do anything to you without your consent and cooperation.
  - A. Many people don't like to admit this because they take great comfort in thinking, *The devil made me do it. He's fighting against me, and I can't help it. I'm not responsible.*
  - B. You might be saying, "Come on, Andrew! You're saying it's my fault?"
  - C. That's exactly what I'm saying.
  - D. If you have an enemy out there who's bigger and stronger than you and you can't stop him, well then, woe is you!
  - E. But if it's your fault that you have allowed Satan to lie to and steal from you, then you can change.
  - F. It's actually good news to find out that you're the problem, because you can change yourself.
- III. Quit being a victim!
  - A. Nobody owes you anything.

- B. Quit being oppressed by people, and stand up and take responsibility for your life.
- C. Declare, "It's not what other people do or don't do. I'm the one who has the authority and power of God. I'm going to choose life, and through Christ, I will live and succeed!"
- D. It doesn't matter what color you are—green or even purple—find out what Jesus has done for you.
- E. Discover who you are and what you have in Christ; then take your authority and start standing on that in faith, and you will prosper.
- F. You might have reasons for being a failure, but you have no excuse; the Lord has made you the head and not the tail; you are above only and not beneath (Deut. 28:13).

#### IV. Words are weapons:

No weapon that is formed against thee shall prosper; and every tongue that shall rise against thee in judgment thou shalt condemn. This is the heritage of the servants of the LORD, and their righteousness is of me, saith the LORD.

Isaiah 54:17

- A. Notice that right after the phrase "no weapon that is formed against thee shall prosper" is the phrase "every tongue that shall rise against thee in judgment thou shalt condemn," which means that these two actions are linked.
- B. You must condemn curses.
- C. You must judge them and say, "No! In the name of Jesus, that's not true for me!"

#### V. God's Word is a seed:

The sower soweth the word.

Mark 4:14

Being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the word of God, which liveth and abideth for ever.

1 Peter 1:23

A. When you plant this seed, it germinates and begins to release the supernatural power within it.

B. But the Word of God isn't the only seed out there; every word that you hear is a seed—every word!

Death and life are in the power of the tongue.

Proverbs 18:21

- C. Everything you hear is either life or death, blessing or cursing.
- D. The moment you hear something contrary to what you're believing God for, you need to stop the speaker right then and say, "In the name of Jesus, that's not so. I condemn it. I judge it!"
- E. If you don't say something right then because you don't want to offend the speaker and you wait until later when you get home, then you will have to root out the unbelief that was spoken.
- F. It can take a while to deal with the unbelief.
- G. Do this even while listening to the radio or watching television.
- VI. The Word says that Jesus "answered" the fig tree (Mark 11:14).
  - A. This means that the fig tree had been talking to Him.
  - B. Speak what God's Word says to things.
  - C. You may think, *Andrew's weird*.
  - D. But you're weird if you're letting the devil run all over you without resisting him.
  - E. One of the reasons Adam lived to be 930 years old (Gen. 5:5) is because it took millennia for the devil to teach people to think sick and expect infirmity.
- VII. When our kids felt sick, we refused to encourage it.
  - A. We taught our kids that being sick isn't good, and as a result, our children weren't sick.
  - B. Don't believe in being sick.
  - C. God's Word says, "There shall no evil befall thee, neither shall any plague come nigh thy dwelling" (Ps. 91:10).

- VIII. It's sad to say, but other Christians will think you're weird for believing in healing, prosperity, and victory.
  - A. One of the most popular doctrines in the body of Christ today is the belief that God controls everything.
  - B. A person who holds to this extreme can blame all of their failure on God, saying, "It's His fault. God must have a plan for me being sick."
  - C. No, you don't have to be sick, poor, or depressed (1 Pet. 2:24 and Ps. 91:10-11)!
- IX. In this verse, God gives you the answer to a multiple-choice test, saying, "Choose life":

I call heaven and earth to record this day against you, that I have set before you life and death, blessing and cursing: therefore choose life, that both thou and thy seed may live.

Deuteronomy 30:19

- A. Why would we choose debt over being debt free?

## Outline

- I. God has different ways of getting His supply to us.
  - A. The two primary ways He uses are blessings and miracles.
  - B. Most Spirit-filled believers—those who speak in tongues and understand that God is real, supernatural, and can do anything—have a tendency to go for the miracles.
  - C. Miracles are for other people (unbelievers) primarily.
  - D. Jesus used miracles like a bell to draw people to Himself, arrest their attention, and confirm His preaching.
  - E. More of the supernatural miracles of God are needed in our services to help encourage people and show them that God is real.
  - F. But our lives aren't going to be sustained off miracles.
  - G. God wants us to walk in blessings because blessings are better than miracles in the long term.
- II. By definition, a miracle is an event that supersedes or suspends natural laws.
  - A. Miracles are supernatural.
  - B. When God created the heavens and the earth, He also spoke into being the natural laws that govern them (Gen. 1:3-5 and 31).
  - C. Unfortunately, the world has been influenced by unbelievers to such a degree that even Christians think that creation evolved, that the earth and the heavens "just happened" naturally.
  - D. When God said, "Let there be light" (Gen. 1:3), "Let the dry land appear" (Gen. 1:9), and "Let the earth bring forth...the fruit tree yielding fruit after his kind, whose seed is in itself" (Gen. 1:11), He had already spent much time thinking about these things and conceiving them in His heart—perhaps even eons.
  - E. When He spoke, His words encapsulated everything that He had been thinking and brought those things into being.

- F. I believe that God thought creation through all the way down to the tiniest detail, the smallest cell and atom.
- G. So, when He supersedes or suspends these natural laws that He created, it's an exception, a miracle.
- H. Miracles aren't the way God really intended for you to live.
- I. He wants you to learn how to operate within the natural laws of creation.
- III. Choosing to rejoice does our souls and bodies good:

A merry heart doeth good like a medicine: but a broken spirit drieth the hones.

Proverbs 17:22

- A. This is one of God's laws in creation.
- B. He created us for fellowship with Him and to be full of joy: "In thy presence is fulness of joy; at thy right hand there are pleasures for evermore" (Ps. 16:11).
- C. Stress, worry, fear, and care are all a result of the Fall.
- D. Medical science has recognized that stress shuts down the immune system, making people susceptible to all kinds of things.
- E. But if we walk in joy with the presence of the Lord, our merry hearts will be like medicine.
- F. Many sicknesses and health conditions won't be able to stay in our bodies when we cooperate with this law God has spoken.
- IV. Exodus 20:12 says that if we honor our fathers and mothers, it will prolong our days and cause us to live long in the land that God has given us.
  - A. Ephesians 6:2-3 confirms this:

Honour thy father and mother; (which is the first commandment with promise;) [3] That it may be well with thee, and thou mayest live long on the earth.

- B. Yet there are many people who are rebellious and don't respect their parents.
- C. I'm not saying that our parents did everything right, but we can still choose to honor them.
- D. The quality of a person's health is linked directly to whether or not they honor their father and mother.
- E. Unfortunately, researchers don't factor this in because they're only looking for physical, tangible things.
- F. There's great benefit to cooperating with God's laws in creation.

### V. God's Word is life and health:

My son, attend to my words; incline thine ear unto my sayings. [21] Let them not depart from thine eyes; keep them in the midst of thine heart. [22] For they are life unto those that find them, and health to all their flesh.

Proverbs 4:20-22

- A. Having a merry heart, honoring our parents and elders, and studying the Word of God are all major factors contributing to good health.
- B. Our humanistic world doesn't consider spiritual things, so they focus on diet, exercise, and other natural things—which is a part of overall health—while ignoring and overlooking these more important factors.
- C. They're majoring on minors and completely missing the majors.
- D. God fashioned our bodies to function a certain way.
- E. When our hearts are full of stress, fear, worry, unforgiveness, and bitterness, God's whole system is corrupted.
- F. But if we walk in joy, peace, and freedom, meditating in the Word and keeping our minds stayed on God, we would discover that the blessing of God would flow (Is. 26:3).
- G. Everything in life would work so much better!

### Living in God's Best

- VI. The church has twisted prayer into something it was never intended to be.
  - A. Prayer is primarily relationship with God.
  - B. Granted, there is a place to intercede for others and rebuke the devil, but that should constitute a very small percentage of your prayer life.
  - C. Prayer ought to be loving God, thanking Him, and fellowshipping together.
  - D. Do you realize that Adam and Eve didn't have anything to pray for?
  - E. They probably met with God every day and said, "Thank You for this beautiful day. It's awesome! I just saw some trees today that I have never seen before. I ate fruit from them and saw animals near them. God, You are awesome!"
- VII. If you fellowship with God, you'll find that things work supernaturally.
  - A. But if you aren't walking in what God has instructed in His Word and you're stressed out, miserable, bitter, in strife, and full of unforgiveness, then you'll have all kinds of problems.
  - B. If you are walking in love, joy, and peace, you won't need a miracle.
  - C. God loves you so much that He will supply miracles for you, but if you learn how to cooperate and walk in the blessings, you wouldn't even need miracles.

- I. The same principle of learning to walk in blessings rather than beg for miracles is also true in the area of finances.
  - A. There are laws that God created about how provision works.
  - B. The Lord said that He would bless the work of your hands (Deut. 28:8 and 12).
  - C. If you set your hand to something, God can multiply that.
  - D. But don't settle for less than God's best.
  - E. Start believing God to be a producer and a contributor.
- II. We shouldn't have this mindset of not needing to work.
  - A. Looking back, I realize now that I wasn't cooperating with God's laws:

Even so hath the Lord ordained that they which preach the gospel should live of the gospel.

1 Corinthians 9:14

- B. Since I wasn't ministering to anybody, I shouldn't have expected to "live of the Gospel."
- C. Jamie and I lived from miracle to miracle.
- D. After moving to Colorado, I was driving and thinking about all of these things and said, "God, we used to see miracles all the time. We'd have to pray every day or else we didn't eat. But now it's been decades since I've had a miracle. It's been a long time since I've had to lay hands on our car and see it run without gas, or since we've been hungry and received a miraculous provision of groceries."
- E. Then the Lord spoke to me, asking, "Would you like to go back to those days?"
- F. I answered, "No, Sir."
- G. If you are going to live from miracle to miracle, you're going to be living from crisis to crisis.

- H. There aren't only natural, physical laws; there are also spiritual laws, such as those in the financial realm:
  - 1. What you set our hands unto, He'll bless (Deut. 28:8).
  - 2. If you don't work, you don't eat (2 Thess. 3:10).
  - 3. A hundred times zero is zero (Gen. 26:12).
- I. The miracles may give you provision when you need it, but if the root of your financial problem remains, then you're going to need another miracle next month and next year because you aren't learning to cooperate and flow with the laws of God.
- J. You learn what the Word of God says about how to prosper and you just put it into practice.
- K. The spiritual laws God created are for your good.
- III. Walking in the blessing of God requires your cooperation.
  - A. You have to access it by faith.
  - B. Receiving a miracle, on the other hand, is basically dependent on how desperate you are.
  - C. If you don't give up or quit and you're still looking to God, you can have a supernatural intervention, but it's going to be after a crisis.
- IV. In contrast to a blessing, a miracle is only temporary; it's never going to become your norm.
  - A. When you get a miracle—a temporary intervention—God's going to eventually return everything back to the natural, spiritual laws.
  - B. This is what happens with some people when they get cancer or some other disease.
  - C. In the natural, it's a life-or-death situation, so they have a surge of faith, believe God, and get miraculously healed.
  - D. But whatever it was that allowed the illness to come in—wrong thinking,

- unforgiveness, bitterness, or whatever (there are multiple things that can cause this)—isn't dealt with.
- E. They leave the root intact, and over time, the physical ailment comes back with a vengeance.
- V. By far, the longest miracle recorded in the Bible is the miracle of the manna (Ex. 16).
  - A. God's people were in a desert, and there wasn't any food to eat.
  - B. God granted them this manna, and it was absolutely supernatural:

Man did eat angels' food.

Psalm 78:25

- C. But it was temporary and lasted only during those forty years in the wilderness (Josh. 5:10-12).
- VI. Here's another difference between a blessing and a miracle: a miracle is always just enough to get you by.
  - A. Manna met a need, but it wasn't an abundance.
  - B. Contrast this with the Promised Land: there, they had all kinds of fruit and meat available to eat.
  - C. The blessing of God comes through natural things:
    - 1. It grows and takes time.
    - 2. You have to plant a seed and then weed and water it.
    - 3. This takes some effort.
- VII. God's plan is for you to live in the blessing.
  - A. The blessing is more abundant and prevents a crisis, whereas a miracle occurs in response to a crisis.
  - B. The blessing isn't temporary; it's eternal.

### Living in God's Best

- C. Later in this book, I'll show you that once you access the blessings of God, you cannot reverse it, and Satan can't stop it.
- D. God gives you miracles because He loves you so much, He's trying to help you.
- E. But you need a miracle because you've been violating spiritual or natural laws.

VIII.Miracles should be for other people, like those who are just coming to the Lord who don't know how to walk in the blessing yet.

- A. They haven't gotten their hearts right and lives conformed to the Word yet.
- B. They aren't walking in joy.
- C. They still have bitterness and unforgiveness.
- D. However, if you understand what is being shared, you ought to get to a place where you say, "God, help me to never need another miracle in my life. Father, teach me what I need to know so that I can walk in Your blessing and prevent crisis. And as I live in the abundance of Your blessing, make me a vessel through whom You can bring miracles to others who need them. Amen."

- I. There are ways that you can prosper outside of God, but it takes away your life (Prov. 1:19).
  - A. The blessing of the Lord will make you rich, and He adds no sorrow with it (Prov. 10:22).
  - B. Although my wife and I lived in poverty for a time because of my own stupidity, God taught me some things, and I've learned to cooperate with Him.
  - C. There's a way to prosper through God that is different than just working your fingers to the bone and stressing yourself out.
- II. Consider what God said to Abraham: "I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and thou shalt be a blessing" (Gen. 12:2).
  - A. If you aren't blessed, you can't bless others.
  - B. Afraid that someone would kill him to get his beautiful wife Sarah, Abraham lied, saying, "She's my sister."
  - C. So, Pharaoh took Sarah into his harem, intending to make her his wife (Gen. 12:10-20).
  - D. Abraham did this same thing a second time, with King Abimelech in Gerar (Gen. 20:1-18).
  - E. God rebuked Pharaoh and King Abimelech and gave Abraham servants, cattle, and sheep.
  - F. Abraham became one of the richest men on the face of the earth, not because he was the most upstanding and perfect guy, but because he believed he was blessed.
- III. Because Abraham believed he was blessed, he was able to let Lot choose the best land for himself (Gen. 13:1-11).
  - A. This shows that Abraham was trusting God.
  - B. He wasn't looking just to natural things.

- C. God was his source and he was obeying Him.
- D. Abraham believed in the blessing, and it was the blessing of God that made him rich.
- IV. God has said that He will bless you (Deut. 15:6).
  - A. It took me a while to figure some things out, but we're blessed now.
  - B. I'm cooperating with God's spiritual laws much more these days, and His blessing has been made manifest in a supernatural, abundant way.
  - C. You must believe!
- V. This blessing of Abraham is now ours:

Christ hath redeemed us from the curse of the law, being made a curse for us: for it is written, Cursed is every one that hangeth on a tree: [14] That the blessing of Abraham might come on the Gentiles through Jesus Christ; that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith.

Galatians 3:13-14

- A. This blessing that God gave Abraham made him very prosperous, but when we read about the blessing, it isn't referring to things.
- B. The blessing of Abraham that is ours today as believers is the favor of God spoken over us.
- C. God blessed by saying (Gen. 1:28).
- D. This is important!
- VI. The Bible is full of blessings—God's favor that has been spoken.
  - A. The words *bless*, *blessed*, *blesseth*, and *blessing* occur about 500 times in the Bible; the words *miracle* and *miracles* occur 37 times.
  - B. Sadly, we live in a culture where words don't mean much.
  - C. Nowadays, people make covenants, contracts, constitutions—whatever—and then just ignore those things and do whatever they want.

- D. Many Christians have been raised in this kind of culture.
- E. We don't understand the power of a blessing.
- F. Since the way that we access the blessing is through faith (Rom. 5:2), we stop that blessing from coming to pass when we don't believe in its power.
- VII. In the blessing of Genesis 1:28, God spoke for you to have dominion over the animals and to subdue them.
  - A. The truth is, the animals are afraid of you:

And God blessed Noah and his sons, and said unto them, Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth. [2] And the fear of you and the dread of you shall be upon every beast of the earth, and upon every fowl of the air, upon all that moveth upon the earth, and upon all the fishes of the sea; into your hand are they delivered.

Genesis 9:1-2

- B. Many Christians don't exercise their God-given authority.
- C. If you are afraid of dogs and bugs, it's because you don't believe that you've been blessed and have dominion and authority over them.
- D. So, it won't work for you.
- E. But you have much more authority than you realize.

## Outline

- I. Isaac's two sons, Jacob and Esau, actually fought over the blessing (Gen. 27:1-34).
  - A. Isaac had received the blessing from his father, Abraham, and Isaac intended to speak the blessing over his older son, Esau.
  - B. While Esau was still out hunting, the younger son, Jacob, went into Isaac's room, pretending to be Esau.
  - C. So, Isaac blessed Jacob instead of Esau.
  - D. When Esau found out, he began to wail and cry because he had lost his father's blessing.
  - E. Most folks don't even care about their fathers' blessing.
  - F. I'm telling you, the attitude expressed in the Bible is the right attitude.
  - G. The Bible says,

Death and life are in the power of the tongue.

Proverbs 18:21

- H. Death and life only—not death, life, and a lot of other stuff—are in the "power of the tongue."
- II. Your parents' words have had influence in your life.
  - A. Perhaps you were cursed by other people—by an extended family member or a teacher.
  - B. Maybe you were told that you would never amount to anything.
  - C. It may not have been a parent who said that, but perhaps an ex from a prior relationship cursed you.
  - D. Maybe you haven't even realized what your problem is, but you were cursed.
  - E. There's power in words!

- III. There's also power in a blessing.
  - A. A blessing is much greater than a curse.
  - B. A curse doesn't have any power over us unless we believe it, unless we fear it (Prov. 26:2).
  - C. Fear is nothing but faith in a negative.
  - D. The favor of God—the blessing that has been spoken over us by Him—has to be believed in order for its power to be released.
  - E. Most of us are quick to believe in curses and the negative.
  - F. We need to reverse that!
  - G. God has spoken thousands of blessings over us, and we need to get to the place where we believe them.
  - H. If we believed in the power of a blessing, it would work.
- IV. You have to believe in the power of your words.
  - A. Jesus said,

Whosoever shall say unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; and shall not doubt in his heart, but shall believe that those things which he saith shall come to pass; he shall have whatsoever he saith.

Mark 11:23

- B. God has enabled you to bless, and He has given you creative power.
- C. If you just say words to see if it'll work, it won't.
- D. But if you can mix faith with your words, there will be creative power in them (Heb. 4:2).
- V. Once you begin operating in the blessing, Satan can't stop it.
  - A. Once it's given, it's eternal and abundant.

- B. If you ever started living in the blessing of God, it would transform your life.
- C. You can get to a place where you never have to have another miracle.
- D. You'll believe for miracles for other people who don't yet know how to walk in the blessings of God, but you'll leave the miracles for unbelievers!
- E. That's the way it should be.
- F. You shouldn't have to be living from crisis to crisis or pit to pit.
- G. You should be walking on the mountaintops, rejoicing.
- H. You can receive from God through either one of these—a blessing or a miracle.

### MY PRAYER FOR YOU:

Father, I pray that the Holy Spirit would help us to understand. I pray for those who are living from crisis to crisis. They're violating spiritual, natural, and emotional laws and are not doing what Your Word says; yet they're believing You for a miracle. I pray that You would speak this word into their hearts right now to encourage them that it doesn't have to be this way, that they don't have to stay this way, that they can tap into Your blessing and the favor You have spoken over them through Your Word. Open their eyes to see all of these wonderful things, all of these exceedingly great and precious promises that You have given us (2 Pet. 1:4). Thank You that we don't have to just barely get by, struggling all the time. Thank You for showing us how to walk in Your blessing!

### PRAY THIS IN FAITH:

Father, thank You for revealing the truth to me. Forgive me for empowering these curses. Forgive me for believing in what they've said. Forgive me for being hurt and offended when You've said so many wonderful things about me. You have blessed me. I am blessed above all people on the face of the earth (Deut. 7:14). Forgive me for letting these curses, these negative words, dominate me. Right now, I take my authority in Christ Jesus, and I speak death to all these curses. In the name of Jesus, I say that I am not going to let any curse that anyone has spoken over me—or that I've spoken over myself—to remain. I break them all, in Jesus's name. I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me (Phil. 4:13). You always make me to triumph in my Lord Jesus Christ (2 Cor. 2:14). I am above only and not beneath. I am the head and not the tail (Deut. 28:13).

I break the curses of doctors, bankers, lawyers, and any other person who has spoken negative things—death words—to me. I renounce these curses in the name of Jesus and refuse to allow them to dominate me anymore. Father, I believe what You have said about me. Your blessing is stronger than any curse, and right now I activate Your blessing by my faith. I put faith in You and in what You have said about me. From this time forth, I am the blessed of the Lord (Ps. 115:15). The blessing of the Lord makes me rich, and You add no sorrow with it (Prov. 10:22). I am blessed coming in and blessed going out (Deut. 28:6). I'm blessed in my basket and in my storehouse (Deut. 28:5). Thank You that everything I set my hand unto is blessed (Deut. 28:8). Thank You, Jesus!

I speak the blessing of God, and I break the curse. That curse is over. It's done. From this moment forward, the curse in my life has ended, and it's the beginning of the blessing. I declare it by faith in Jesus's name. Amen. Hallelujah!

  - B. Our desire to compromise, to be secure, and to not stretch ourselves out in faith is a hindrance to receiving God's best.
  - C. Receiving God's best isn't about getting the Lord to do something.
  - D. This is expressed in statements like "Faith moves God."
  - E. Faith does not move God.
  - F. God moved by grace, and our faith only appropriates what God has already provided by grace; that's a life-changing truth!

  - B. It's important to remember that blessings aren't things.

- C. If something happened and I lost everything, I'd get it back because His blessing produced those things in the first place; it would just be a matter of time.
- D. The favor of God is the real asset!
- E. There are some people who, if you touch their things, you've touched their hearts!
- F. When we have our faith in the Lord, it doesn't matter what happens to our things.
- G. If Satan steals something from us, we can make him repay with interest:

But if he [a thief, see Prov. 6:30] be found, he shall restore sevenfold; he shall give all the substance of his house.

- H. If we believe that we're blessed, it doesn't matter what people do to us.

- I. King Balak of Moab was distressed because of God's people, so he sent to Balaam to come and curse the Israelites so that the Moabite forces could win a battle.
  - A. This sounds foolish today.
  - B. We look at things like this as being superstitious.
  - C. Society today doesn't have the same attitude that Bible people had about words—the proper attitude.
  - D. Words are important.
- II. There is power in words if a person believes them.
  - A. Most people don't believe all this stuff today, so it stops a lot of curses from coming to pass.
  - B. It also stops a lot of blessing from coming to pass.
  - C. Jesus's disciples were awestruck at how He just spoke to a fig tree (Matt. 21:18-20, see also Mark 11:12-14 and 20-21) and killed it.
  - D. But Jesus said to His disciples,

Have faith in God. [23] For verily I say unto you, That whosoever shall say unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; and shall not doubt in his heart, but shall believe that those things which he saith shall come to pass; he shall have whatsoever he saith.

Mark 11:22-23

- E. The only reason there aren't mountains moving around is because nobody has this faith.
- F. Words created this physical world (Heb. 11:3).
- G. Words are the parent force.
- H. Everything on this earth will respond to words—your body, cancer, blindness—anything will respond to words *if* you believe in your heart and don't doubt.

- III. King Balak sent an entourage to hire Balaam to curse the Israelites.
  - A. God takes cursing seriously and told Balaam not to do it (Num. 22:7-12).
  - B. According to the New Testament, Balaam loved the rewards of unrighteousness (Jude 11 and 2 Pet. 2:15).
  - C. He was prone to curse the Israelites.
  - D. It angered God that he wasn't following His instructions (Num. 22:21-22).
  - E. The donkey started talking to Balaam (Num. 22:23-28), and her reasoning was better than his (2 Pet. 2:16)!
  - F. Finally, Balaam yielded, saying, "If it displeases You, I won't go," but the Lord said, "All right, you can go, but make sure you only speak what I say."
  - G. In Numbers 23, Balak brought Balaam up to a high place where he began to bless Israel instead of cursing them.
- IV. We ought to take this verse, put it someplace prominent, memorize it, and live by it:

God is not a man, that he should lie; neither the son of man, that he should repent: hath he said, and shall he not do it? or hath he spoken, and shall he not make it good?

Numbers 23:19

- A. If God has said something, it will come to pass.
- B. We should all have this attitude!
- C. Balaam, the greatest soothsayer of his day, basically admitted, "I cannot reverse God's blessing" (Num. 23:20).
- D. Once we receive the blessing of God, nothing and no one in Satan's kingdom—including the devil himself—can stop it.

#### NUMBERS 22:1-35

And the children of Israel set forward, and pitched in the plains of Moab on this side Jordan by Jericho. [2] And Balak the son of Zippor saw all that Israel had done to the Amorites. [3] And Moab was sore afraid of the people, because they were many: and Moab was distressed because of the children of Israel. [7] And the elders of Moab and the elders of Midian departed with the rewards of divination in their hand; and they came unto Balaam, and spake unto him the words of Balak. [8] And he said unto them, Lodge here this night, and I will bring you word again, as the LORD shall speak unto me: and the princes of Moab abode with Balaam. [9] And God came unto Balaam, and said, What men are these with thee? [10] And Balaam said unto God, Balak the son of Zippor, king of Moab, hath sent unto me, saying, [11] Behold, there is a people come out of Egypt, which covereth the face of the earth: come now, curse me them; peradventure I shall be able to overcome them, and drive them out. [12] And God said unto Balaam, Thou shalt not go with them; thou shalt not curse the people: for they are blessed. [13] And Balaam rose up in the morning, and said unto the princes of Balak, Get you into your land: for the LORD refuseth to give me leave to go with you. [14] And the princes of Moab rose up, and they went unto Balak, and said, Balaam refuseth to come with us. [15] And Balak sent yet again princes, more, and more honourable than they. [16] And they came to Balaam, and said to him, Thus saith Balak the son of Zippor, Let nothing, I pray thee, hinder thee from coming unto me: [17] For I will promote thee unto very great honour, and I will do whatsoever thou savest unto me: come therefore, I pray thee, curse me this people. [18] And Balaam answered and said unto the servants of Balak, If Balak would give me his house full of silver and gold, I cannot go beyond the word of the LORD my God, to do less or more. [19] Now therefore, I pray you, tarry ye also here this night, that I may know what the LORD will say unto me more. [20] And God

came unto Balaam at night, and said unto him. If the men come to call thee, rise up, and go with them; but yet the word which I shall say unto thee, that shalt thou do. [21] And Balaam rose up in the morning, and saddled his ass, and went with the princes of Moab. [22] And God's anger was kindled because he went: and the angel of the LORD stood in the way for an adversary against him. Now he was riding upon his ass, and his two servants were with him. [23] And the ass saw the angel of the LORD standing in the way, and his sword drawn in his hand: and the ass turned aside out of the way, and went into the field: and Balaam smote the ass, to turn her into the way. [24] But the angel of the LORD stood in a path of the vineyards, a wall being on this side, and a wall on that side. [25] And when the ass saw the angel of the LORD, she thrust herself unto the wall, and crushed Balaam's foot against the wall: and he smote her again. [26] And the angel of the LORD went further, and stood in a narrow place, where was no way to turn either to the right hand or to the left. [27] And when the ass saw the angel of the LORD, she fell down under Balaam: and Balaam's anger was kindled, and he smote the ass with a staff. [28] And the LORD opened the mouth of the ass, and she said unto Balaam, What have I done unto thee, that thou hast smitten me these three times? [29] And Balaam said unto the ass, Because thou hast mocked me: I would there were a sword in mine hand, for now would I kill thee. [30] And the ass said unto Balaam, Am not I thine ass, upon which thou hast ridden ever since I was thine unto this day? was I ever wont to do so unto thee? And he said, Nay. [31] Then the LORD opened the eyes of Balaam, and he saw the angel of the LORD standing in the way, and his sword drawn in his hand: and he bowed down his head, and fell flat on his face. [32] And the angel of the LORD said unto him, Wherefore hast thou smitten thine ass these three times? behold, I went out to withstand thee, because thy way is perverse before me: [33] And the ass saw me, and turned from me these three times: unless she had turned from me, surely now also I had slain thee, and saved her alive. [34] And Balaam said unto the angel of the LORD, I have sinned; for I knew not that thou stoodest in the way against me: now therefore, if it displease thee, I will get me back again. [35] And the angel of the LORD said unto Balaam, Go with the men: but only the word that I shall speak unto thee, that thou shalt speak. So Balaam went with the princes of Balak.

#### NUMBERS 21:21-35

And Israel sent messengers unto Sihon king of the Amorites, saying, [22] Let me pass through thy land: we will not turn into the fields, or into the vineyards; we will not drink of the waters of the well: but we will go along by the king's high way, until we be past thy borders. [23] And Sihon would not suffer Israel to pass through his border: but Sihon

gathered all his people together, and went out against Israel into the wilderness: and he came to Jahaz, and fought against Israel. [24] And Israel smote him with the edge of the sword, and possessed his land from Arnon unto Jabbok, even unto the children of Ammon: for the border of the children of Ammon was strong. [25] And Israel took all these cities: and Israel dwelt in all the cities of the Amorites, in Heshbon, and in all the villages thereof. [26] For Heshbon was the city of Sihon the king of the Amorites, who had fought against the former king of Moab, and taken all his land out of his hand, even unto Arnon. [27] Wherefore they that speak in proverbs say, Come into Heshbon, let the city of Sihon be built and prepared: [28] For there is a fire gone out of Heshbon, a flame from the city of Sihon: it hath consumed Ar of Moab, and the lords of the high places of Arnon. [29] Woe to thee, Moab! thou art undone, O people of Chemosh: he hath given his sons that escaped, and his daughters, into captivity unto Sihon king of the Amorites. [30] We have shot at them; Heshbon is perished even unto Dibon, and we have laid them waste even unto Nophah, which reacheth unto Medeba. [31] Thus Israel dwelt in the land of the Amorites. [32] And Moses sent to spy out Jaazer, and they took the villages thereof, and drove out the Amorites that were there. [33] And they turned and went up by the way of Bashan: and Og the king of Bashan went out against them, he, and all his people, to the battle at Edrei. [34] And the LORD said unto Moses, Fear him not: for I have delivered him into thy hand, and all his people, and his land; and thou shalt do to him as thou didst unto Sihon king of the Amorites, which dwelt at Heshbon. [35] So they smote him, and his sons, and all his people, until there was none left him alive: and they possessed his land.

#### **GENESIS 19:30-38**

And Lot went up out of Zoar, and dwelt in the mountain, and his two daughters with him; for he feared to dwell in Zoar: and he dwelt in a cave, he and his two daughters. [31] And the firstborn said unto the younger, Our father is old, and there is not a man in the earth to come in unto us after the manner of all the earth: [32] Come, let us make our father drink wine, and we will lie with him, that we may preserve seed of our father. [33] And they made their father drink wine that night: and the firstborn went in, and lay with her father; and he perceived not when she lay down, nor when she arose. [34] And it came to pass on the morrow, that the firstborn said unto the younger, Behold, I lay yesternight with my father: let us make him drink wine this night also; and go thou in, and lie with him, that we may preserve seed of our father. [35] And they made their father drink wine that night also: and the younger arose, and lay with him; and he perceived not when she lay down, nor when she arose. [36] Thus were both the daughters of Lot

with child by their father. [37] And the firstborn bare a son, and called his name Moab: the same is the father of the Moabites unto this day. [38] And the younger, she also bare a son, and called his name Benammi: the same is the father of the children of Ammon unto this day.

#### PROVERBS 18:21

Death and life are in the power of the tongue: and they that love it shall eat the fruit thereof.

#### MARK 11:12-14

And on the morrow, when they were come from Bethany, he was hungry: [13] And seeing a fig tree afar off having leaves, he came, if haply he might find any thing thereon: and when he came to it, he found nothing but leaves; for the time of figs was not yet. [14] And Jesus answered and said unto it, No man eat fruit of thee hereafter for ever. And his disciples heard it.

[2] And the woman said unto the serpent, We may eat of the fruit of the trees of the garden: [3] But of the fruit of the tree which is in the midst of the garden, God hath said, Ye shall not eat of it, neither shall ye touch it, lest ye die. [4] And the serpent said unto the woman, Ye shall not surely die: [5] For God doth know that in the day ye eat thereof, then your eyes shall be opened, and ye shall be as gods, knowing good and evil.

#### **NUMBERS 22:38**

And Balaam said unto Balak, Lo, I am come unto thee: have I now any power at all to say any thing? the word that God putteth in my mouth, that shall I speak.

#### NUMBERS 23:18-20

And he took up his parable, and said, Rise up, Balak, and hear; hearken unto me, thou son of Zippor: [19] God is not a man, that he should lie; neither the son of man, that he should repent: hath he said, and shall he not do it? or hath he spoken, and shall he not make it good? [20] Behold, I have received commandment to bless: and he hath blessed; and I cannot reverse it.

  - A. People came to me and asked, "Are you putting your building up for sale?
  - B. I replied, "I hope he moves in next door. That guy needs Jesus."
  - C. People who get overwhelmed by that stuff don't understand the power of the blessing.
- II. Satan can't stop what God has said and done, unless you get into fear and believe that he can.
  - A. I sat next to a satanic high priest on a flight.
  - B. The man wanted to curse me, cut out my heart, and offer me for a sacrifice.
  - C. I lit into the guy: "Your god's a loser. He's a nobody!"
  - D. Then the man threatened me, saying, "I've killed twenty-seven people, offering their hearts as a human sacrifice. I can curse you, and you'll be dead in minutes!"
  - E. I replied, "Proverbs 26:2 says that the curse causeless shall not come. I dare you. Curse me. It'll come back on you. Shoot your best shot!"
  - F. Of course, I also told him about the goodness of God and gave him an opportunity to be saved, but he didn't take it.
- III. God has blessed you, and that blessing cannot be reversed unless you reverse it.
  - A. You need to start believing in the power of a blessing!
  - B. When Balaam said that God had not beheld iniquity in Jacob, it wasn't because there wasn't any (Num. 23:20-21).
  - C. The Lord saw perverseness and iniquity (Ex. 32:9-10), but when it came to the enemy trying to curse Israel, their goodness or badness didn't affect Him.

- D. He dealt with them on the basis of covenant.
- IV. God also deals with you on the basis of covenant—your new covenant in Christ.
  - A. When somebody tries to come out against you, Satan will make you think, *Well, I deserve this treatment.*
  - B. You are blessed by God, and it doesn't matter whether you're doing everything you should or not.
  - C. Even at your worst, you are better than the devil at his best.
  - D. No matter how bad you may be living, you have a covenant with God, and you shouldn't be afraid of the devil.
  - E. Satan is afraid of you (James 4:7)!
- V. If you are born again and Jesus lives in your heart, you're blessed.
  - A. If you can understand and believe that you're blessed, you ought to defy sickness, disease, cancer, and poverty; those things are curses!
  - B. Deuteronomy 28:1-14 list what God considers blessings, and Deuteronomy 28:15-68 list all the curses.
  - C. Positive things are listed as blessings, and negative things are considered curses.
  - D. Religion has come along and made many Christians call sickness "good" and healing "of the devil" (Is. 5:20).
  - E. There is nothing—no enchantment—that can come against you (Num. 23:23) unless you empower it by your unbelief.

[21] The LORD shall make the pestilence cleave unto thee, until he have consumed thee from off the land, whither thou goest to possess it. [22] The LORD shall smite thee with a consumption, and with a fever, and with an inflammation, and with an extreme burning, and with the sword, and with blasting, and with mildew; and they shall pursue thee until thou perish. [23] And thy heaven that is over thy head shall be brass, and the earth that is under thee shall be iron. [24] The LORD shall make the rain of thy land powder and dust: from heaven shall it come down upon thee, until thou be destroyed. [25] The LORD shall cause thee to be smitten before thine enemies: thou shalt go out one way against them, and flee

seven ways before them: and shalt be removed into all the kingdoms of the earth. [28] The LORD shall smite thee with madness, and blindness, and astonishment of heart: [29] And thou shalt grope at noonday, as the blind gropeth in darkness, and thou shalt not prosper in thy ways: and thou shalt be only oppressed and spoiled evermore, and no man shall save thee. [30] Thou shalt betroth a wife, and another man shall lie with her: thou shalt build an house, and thou shalt not dwell therein: thou shalt plant a vineyard, and shalt not gather the grapes thereof. [31] Thine ox shall be slain before thine eyes, and thou shalt not eat thereof: thine ass shall be violently taken away from before thy face, and shall not be restored to thee: thy sheep shall be given unto thine enemies, and thou shalt have none to rescue them. [32] Thy sons and thy daughters shall be given unto another people, and thine eyes shall look, and fail with longing for them all the day long: and there shall be no might in thine hand. [33] The fruit of thy land, and all thy labours, shall a nation which thou knowest not eat up; and thou shalt be only oppressed and crushed alway: [34] So that thou shalt be mad for the sight of thine eyes which thou shalt see. [35] The LORD shall smite thee in the knees, and in the legs, with a sore botch that cannot be healed, from the sole of thy foot unto the top of thy head. [36] The LORD shall bring thee, and thy king which thou shalt set over thee, unto a nation which neither thou nor thy fathers have known; and there shalt thou serve other gods, wood and stone. [37] And thou shalt become an astonishment, a proverb, and a byword, among all nations whither the LORD shall lead thee. [38] Thou shalt carry much seed out into the field, and shalt gather but little in; for the locust shall consume it. [39] Thou shalt plant vineyards, and dress them, but shalt neither drink of the wine, nor gather the grapes; for the worms shall eat them. [40] Thou shalt have olive trees throughout all thy coasts, but thou shalt not anoint thyself with the oil; for thine olive shall cast his fruit. [41] Thou shalt beget sons and daughters, but thou shalt not enjoy them; for they shall go into captivity. [42] All thy trees and fruit of thy land shall the locust consume. [43] The stranger that is within thee shall get up above thee very high; and thou shalt come down very low. [44] He shall lend to thee, and thou shalt not lend to him: he shall be the head, and thou shalt be the tail. [45] Moreover all these curses shall come upon thee, and shall pursue thee, and overtake thee, till thou be destroyed; because thou hearkenedst not unto the voice of the LORD thy God, to keep his commandments and his statutes which he commanded thee: [46] And they shall be upon thee for a sign and for a wonder, and upon thy seed for ever [47] Because thou servedst not the

LORD thy God with joyfulness, and with gladness of heart, for the abundance of all things; [48] Therefore shalt thou serve thine enemies which the LORD shall send against thee, in hunger, and in thirst, and in nakedness, and in want of all things: and he shall put a yoke of iron upon thy neck, until he have destroyed thee. [49] The LORD shall bring a nation against thee from far, from the end of the earth, as swift as the eagle flieth; a nation whose tongue thou shalt not understand; [50] A nation of fierce countenance, which shall not regard the person of the old, nor shew favour to the young: [51] And he shall eat the fruit of thy cattle, and the fruit of thy land, until thou be destroyed: which also shall not leave thee either corn, wine, or oil, or the increase of thy kine, or flocks of thy sheep, until he have destroyed thee. [52] And he shall besiege thee in all thy gates, until thy high and fenced walls come down, wherein thou trustedst, throughout all thy land: and he shall besiege thee in all thy gates throughout all thy land, which the LORD thy God hath given thee. [53] And thou shalt eat the fruit of thine own body, the flesh of thy sons and of thy daughters, which the LORD thy God hath given thee, in the siege, and in the straitness, wherewith thine enemies shall distress thee: [54] So that the man that is tender among you, and very delicate, his eye shall be evil toward his brother, and toward the wife of his bosom, and toward the remnant of his children which he shall leave: [55] So that he will not give to any of them of the flesh of his children whom he shall eat: because he hath nothing left him in the siege, and in the straitness, wherewith thine enemies shall distress thee in all thy gates. [56] The tender and delicate woman among you, which would not adventure to set the sole of her foot upon the ground for delicateness and tenderness, her eye shall be evil toward the husband of her bosom, and toward her son, and toward her daughter, [57] And toward her young one that cometh out from between her feet, and toward her children which she shall bear: for she shall eat them for want of all things secretly in the siege and straitness, wherewith thine enemy shall distress thee in thy gates. [58] If thou wilt not observe to do all the words of this law that are written in this book, that thou mayest fear this glorious and fearful name, THE LORD THY GOD; [59] Then the LORD will make thy plagues wonderful, and the plagues of thy seed, even great plagues, and of long continuance, and sore sicknesses, and of long continuance. [60] Moreover he will bring upon thee all the diseases of Egypt, which thou wast afraid of; and they shall cleave unto thee. [61] Also every sickness, and every plague, which is not written in the book of this law, them will the LORD bring upon thee, until thou be destroyed. [62] And ye shall be left few in number, whereas ye were as the stars of heaven for multitude; because thou wouldest not obey the voice of the LORD thy God. [63] And it shall come to pass, that as the LORD rejoiced over you to do you good, and to multiply you; so the LORD will rejoice

over you to destroy you, and to bring you to nought; and ye shall be plucked from off the land whither thou goest to possess it. [64] And the LORD shall scatter thee among all people, from the one end of the earth even unto the other; and there thou shalt serve other gods, which neither thou nor thy fathers have known, even wood and stone. [65] And among these nations shalt thou find no ease, neither shall the sole of thy foot have rest: but the LORD shall give thee there a trembling heart, and failing of eyes, and sorrow of mind: [66] And thy life shall hang in doubt before thee; and thou shalt fear day and night, and shalt have none assurance of thy life: [67] In the morning thou shalt say, Would God it were even! and at even thou shalt say, Would God it were morning! for the fear of thine heart wherewith thou shalt fear, and for the sight of thine eyes which thou shalt see. ### Outline

- I. Many people think that the sin Balaam was rebuked for in the New Testament was when he went to meet with King Balak and the angel stood there along the way, about to kill him.
  - A. Yes, Balaam was wrong, and the angel would have killed him; but the New Testament rebukes Balaam for something else (Rev. 2:12-14).
  - B. Balaam taught Balak to cast a stumbling block before the Israelites—to entice them to eat things sacrificed to idols and to commit fornication.
  - C. Many Israelites participated, and the wrath of God came on them.
  - D. The only way God's people could be overcome was if they rejected their own covenant.
- II. Before Christ came and established the New Covenant, people who gave themselves over to demons through idol worship had no cure.
  - A. Like cutting out a cancer in order to save someone's life, so was purging the human race from demon-possessed individuals back then.
  - B. It was actually an act of mercy toward humanity as a whole to just kill all the men, women, children, and animals who participated in demonic rituals.
  - C. This helped keep the evil from spreading further and protected what purity remained.
- III. Your receiving God's blessing isn't up to Him; neither is it up to the devil.
  - A. It's up to you.
  - B. You are the one who establishes whether or not God's blessing comes to pass in your life.
  - C. You are the one who empowers a curse.

  - D. God has blessed us, and it cannot be reversed!
  - E. We need to start empowering the blessing by faith and stop fearing what people have said about us and what they have done to us.
  - F. This is the better way to receive!
- VIII. God's blessings are voice-activated.
  - A. You have to say them.
  - B. Words created you and everything in the physical realm that you can see.
  - C. So, start speaking your blessing!
  - D. Encourage yourself.
  - E. When the doctor says that you're dying, say, "Not today, praise God!"

- D. Jesus essentially declared, "Everything that I've done, you can do" (John 14:12).
- II. You are blessed with everything:

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who hath [past tense] blessed us with all spiritual blessings in heavenly places in Christ.

Ephesians 1:3, brackets mine

- A. The Lord is not responding to your situation.
- B. He doesn't find out about your problem when you realize that you have it.
- C. Before you ever had a problem, the supply was already created (Phil. 4:19).
- III. No matter the situation or circumstance, we can decide to keep our minds on the promises in God's Word.
  - A. It's comforting to know how much He loves and cares for us.
  - B. The Bible says,

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. [2] Therefore will not we fear, though the earth be removed, and though the mountains be carried into the midst of the sea.

Psalm 46:1-2

C. We can reach a place where we say, "God, I don't care what happens: earthquake, tsunami, recession, epidemic, or attack. It doesn't matter what

goes on—I'm blessed! You made the supply before I had the need, and whatever I'm going through, I'm going to keep my eyes fixed on You! Nothing will destroy me."

- D. It's attainable by faith.
- IV. You're already blessed with all spiritual blessings (Eph. 1:3).
  - A. For whatever reason, the truth of this verse doesn't register with many people.
  - B. So, let's see some more specifics.
  - C. First, you need to know how to properly interpret the Old Testament.
  - D. In the Old Testament, blessings were conditional on a person's performance.
  - E. In the New Testament, everything is conditional upon Jesus's performance and whether you put faith in Him or not.
  - F. If you have faith in Christ, then you get everything that God's provided, whether you deserve it or not.
  - G. If you receive the Lord, then you receive everything He has to offer.
- V. When Jesus was crucified on a tree—the cross—He drew that curse onto Himself (Gal. 3:13).
  - A. He was made a curse for us and redeemed us from the curse, "that the blessing of Abraham might come on the Gentiles through Jesus Christ; that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith" (Gal. 3:14).
  - B. Notice the word *all* that is put in boldface in this passage:

And it shall come to pass, if thou shalt hearken diligently unto the voice of the LORD thy God, to observe and to do all his commandments which I command thee this day, that the LORD thy God will set thee on high above all nations of the earth: [2] And all these blessings shall come on thee, and overtake thee, if thou shalt hearken unto the voice of the LORD thy God.

Deuteronomy 28:1-2, emphasis mine

C. This means that we have to do ALL of the commandments to receive the blessings.

- D. Most New Testament Christians mistakenly interpret this and think, No wonder I'm in this mess! I haven't done this and that and this or that.
- E. The way to read Deuteronomy 28 through New Covenant eyes is to say, "All these blessings are now mine in Christ because Jesus hearkened diligently to observe and to do all of the commandments. Because He did, and because I have faith in Him, all of these blessings are coming upon me. All of the curses that are written here are now turned into blessings. Everything written here as a curse is not for me. I'm not under that curse, so I receive the opposite!"
- VI. When Jamie and I first started out in marriage and ministry, we had mildew in our closets.
  - A. Mildew is a curse (Deut. 28:22).
  - B. We opened our closets and cursed the curse.
  - C. We believed the Word, and because we believed, we spoke to mildew and it left.
  - D. You ought to read Deuteronomy 28:15-68 and see for yourself the curses you can curse.
  - E. You get the blessing, not because you've done everything right, but because Jesus did everything right.

- B. You and all that's yours will be fruitful in every way:

Blessed shall be the fruit of thy body, and the fruit of thy ground, and the fruit of thy cattle, the increase of thy kine, and the flocks of thy sheep.

Deuteronomy 28:4

- C. You can use this verse to pray over your dog, cat, goldfish, or whatever else you have.
- D. They're blessed because they belong to you!
- II. God can't bless your storehouse if you don't have one:

Blessed shall be thy basket and thy store.

Deuteronomy 28:5

- A. If you don't have any extra set aside somewhere, the Lord can't bless it.
- B. The Lord will bless your savings—your storehouse.
- C. You need to start some savings.
- III. We need to remind ourselves that it doesn't matter whether we are coming or going—we're blessed:

Blessed shalt thou be when thou comest in, and blessed shalt thou be when thou goest out.

Deuteronomy 28:6

- A. We are blessed anywhere we are.
- B. If we're born again, then we're blessed through Jesus whether or not we know it and believe it.

- C. God told us to choose (Deut. 30:19).
- D. Since we get to choose, we must choose—and continue to choose—to be blessed.

#### IV. This is powerful:

Deuteronomy 28:7

- A. "Thine enemies" isn't only talking about people.
- B. "Thine enemies" could be poverty, sickness, worry, stress, and anything else that's against you.
- C. They will not prosper (Is. 54:17)!
- V. Verse 8 agrees with verse 2 of the same chapter:

The LORD shall command the blessing upon thee.

Deuteronomy 28:8a

And all these blessings shall come on thee, and overtake thee.

Deuteronomy 28:2

- A. We can't outrun the blessing of God.
- B. The blessing of God is pursuing us, chasing us, and trying to get us blessed.
- C. But we have to cooperate.
- D. We have to believe and start speaking it.
- E. The blessings of God are voice-activated.
- VI. God doesn't have anything to bless if you aren't setting your hand unto something:

The LORD shall command the blessing upon thee in thy storehouses, and in all that thou settest thine hand unto.

Deuteronomy 28:8

- A. One hundred times zero is zero.
- B. A person can prosper more by working at McDonald's—even though they may take a cut in their welfare payment—because they're doing something, and God can multiply that.
- C. But He can't multiply welfare.
- D. You can reject it if you want to, but it's the truth.

VII. Isaac had a king ask him to leave because he was mightier and wealthier than that king's whole nation (Gen. 26:12-17).

- A. This is the way it's supposed to be.
- B. God wants you to be so blessed that other people can see it:

The LORD shall establish thee an holy people unto himself, as he hath sworn unto thee, if thou shalt keep the commandments of the LORD thy God, and walk in his ways. [10] And all people of the earth shall see that thou art called by the name of the LORD; and they shall be afraid of thee.

Deuteronomy 28:9-10

- C. It may take a while because there's got to be a time of renewing your mind and of sowing and reaping.
- D. You don't just jump into this automatically, but this ought to be your goal.
- E. You ought to be saying, "I'm blessed of God, and everybody's going to see it. It will manifest, and they'll recognize the Lord's blessing in my life."
- F. All glory to Jesus!

#### VIII. These verses are powerful:

And the LORD shall make thee plenteous in goods, in the fruit of thy body, and in the fruit of thy cattle, and in the fruit of thy ground, in the land which the LORD sware unto thy fathers to give thee. [12] The LORD

shall open unto thee his good treasure, the heaven to give the rain unto thy land in his season, and to bless all the work of thine hand: and thou shalt lend unto many nations, and thou shalt not borrow.

Deuteronomy 28:11-12

- A. You can break droughts.
- B. Jamie and I have prayed and broken droughts.
- C. We may not have been the only ones who prayed, but I believe that our prayer and faith made a difference.
- D. Yours can too.
- IX. You are supposed to be the head and not the tail:

### Outline

- I. Many of us have swallowed the lies of this world even more than we realize.
  - A. We've let the world tell us, "You can't do this and you can't do that," "It's the season for you to get sick," "You have to have this," or "You're a certain age, so you have to have that."
  - B. That's walking in the counsel of the ungodly and expecting negative things, just like an ungodly person does:

Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful.

Psalm 1:1

- C. We need to look at people in the Bible like Moses. He lived to be 120 years old, and his natural force wasn't abated and his eyesight wasn't dim (Deut. 34:7).
- D. If Moses could do that, and what we have is better than what he had, then what he had ought to be the minimum that we expect (Heb. 8:6).
- E. We're the ones who determine whether or not the blessing is working in our lives!
- II. As believers in Christ, this should describe us:

But his delight is in the law of the LORD [the Word of God]; and in his law doth he meditate day and night.

Psalm 1:2, brackets mine

- A. This is speaking of meditating in God's Word more than just every once in a while.
- B. Certainly, listening to the Word at church and using a daily devotional is a beginning, but this verse is talking about meditating in God's Word day and night.
- C. It's referring to God's Word being in our ears, in our eyes, on our minds, and in our mouths all the time.
- D. In other words, if we delight in God's Word and meditate on it day and night, then we'll be blessed.

- III. The Bible says that true believers—the just—shall live by faith (Hab. 2:4, Rom. 1:17, Gal. 3:11, and Heb. 10:38).
  - A. Many Christians just visit faith, but they don't live there.
  - B. In order to actually live in faith, you must meditate constantly in the Word.
  - C. It's a day-and-night process, but when you do it, you will make your way prosperous and you will have good success (Josh. 1:8).
  - D. That's another blessing!
- IV. When you meditate on the Word day and night, whatsoever you do will prosper:

And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season; his leaf also shall not wither; and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper.

Psalm 1:3

- A. You might say, "I'm going to claim that one!"
- B. Well, are you going to quit walking in the counsel of the ungodly, standing in the way of sinners, and sitting in the seat of the scornful?
- C. Are you going to meditate in God's Word day and night?
- D. Those things are all linked together.
- E. Although it's not based on your holiness, it does take a total commitment for you to see God's blessing manifest in your life.
- F. This verse paints a picture of a tree that is planted next to water.
- G. Even in a drought, that tree will still flourish because its roots draw nourishment from the river.
- V. The Holy Spirit will show you things to come:

Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, that shall he speak: and he will shew you things to come.

John 16:13

- A. That's another blessing!
- B. You don't have to be like a pinball that just bounces off things, going round and round again.
- C. You can hear from God (John 10:3-5)!
- VI. We say we're forgiven, but many of us don't even understand what that means.
  - A. To have our sins atoned for and wiped out is a huge blessing:

Blessed is he whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered. [2] Blessed is the man unto whom the LORD imputeth not iniquity, and in whose spirit there is no guile.

Psalm 32:1-2

- B. Many people don't understand the magnitude of this blessing because religion has hidden this truth, saying, "Yeah, when you got born again, your sins up to that point were forgiven. But every time you sin after that, you have to get that sin confessed and under the blood."
- C. This makes forgiveness conditional upon having every sin confessed.
- VII. Sin isn't only the wrong things we do:

For whatsoever is not of faith is sin.

Romans 14:23

Therefore to him that knoweth to do good, and doeth it not, to him it is sin.

James 4:17

- A. Sin is also not doing the good things that we should be doing but fail to do.
- B. If we use a Bible definition of sin, then we sin all the time.
- C. Because of this, our own consciences condemn us, saying, "You're not worthy. You're separated from God."
- D. But that's not what the Word teaches.

[15] And for this cause he is the mediator of the new testament, that by means of death, for the redemption of the transgressions that were under the first testament, they which are called might receive the promise of eternal inheritance.

Hebrews 9:12 and 15

For the law having a shadow of good things to come, and not the very image of the things, can never with those sacrifices which they offered year by year continually make the comers thereunto perfect. [2] For then would they not have ceased to be offered? because that the worshippers once purged should have had no more conscience of sins.

Hebrews 10:1-2

By the which will we are sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.... [14] For by one offering he hath perfected for ever them that are sanctified.

Hebrews 10:10 and 14

But ye are come unto mount Sion, and unto the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to an innumerable company of angels, [23] To the general assembly and church of the firstborn, which are written in heaven, and to God the Judge of all, and to the spirits of just men made perfect.

- B. You might wonder, But, Andrew, how can God forgive a sin before I commit it?
- C. Well, you'd better pray that He can forgive a sin before you commit it because He only died for your sins one time 2,000 years ago, long before you ever committed them.
- D. If you're born again, sin is not an issue between you and God.

- II. If you go out and live in sin, you're just inviting Satan in (Rom. 6:16).
  - A. You're throwing open the door to your life and saying, "Shoot your best shot! Destroy me. Have at me."

The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy.

John 10:10

- B. If you're living in sin, you're stupid.
- C. But God loves you, stupid.
- III. Speaking of God's grace, Paul quoted these verses in Romans:

Even as David also describeth the blessedness of the man, unto whom God imputeth righteousness without works, [7] Saying, Blessed are they whose iniquities are forgiven, and whose sins are covered. [8] Blessed is the man to whom the Lord will not [future tense] impute sin.

Romans 4:6-8, brackets mine

- A. Verse 8 doesn't say "did not" or "does not," but "will not."
- B. God will never hold sin against you!
- C. Now, it's true that if you're in sin, you won't prosper, but that's not because God isn't blessing you.
- D. You might be saying, "Come on, Andrew. What's the difference? Either way, I'm not prospering!"
- E. The difference is that if you think God is angry with you and is imputing your sins unto you, then you'll never have any boldness, confidence, or faith.
- F. But if you understand this truth, you can say, "God, thank You that You never turned away from me. You never took the blessing back. I stopped it through my own stupidity. I gave Satan this place in my life. I welcomed him in. How dumb can I get and still breathe? Thank You, God, that You still love me."
- G. Then you can just turn on the devil and say, "I don't care what I've done. Jesus is still my Lord, and I refuse to allow you to dominate me" (James 4:7).
- H. It's huge for you to understand that your transgressions have been forgiven and that all your iniquity has been taken away (Ps. 103:11-12).

# Outline

I. When you trust in God, there's a blessing that comes upon you:

O taste and see that the LORD is good: blessed is the man that trusteth in him.

Psalm 34:8

- A. It's better to rely on Him instead of trusting in yourself, because when you do, you're blessed!
- B. Peace is one of the blessings that comes through trusting in God:

Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on thee: because he trusteth in thee.

Isaiah 26:3

- C. Many Christians struggle with peace.
- D. They're stressed-out and worried.
- E. They feel like they've failed and deserve whatever is happening to them—that God is holding sin against them.
- F. These things add up and compound upon each other.
- II. You need to understand that you are forgiven of all sin.
  - A. If God forgave you of your sins, which is the greatest miracle that could ever happen, how could you believe that He won't heal you?
  - B. If He loved you enough to forgive you of your sins, then He loves you enough to heal your body.
  - C. He'd keep you in perfect peace!
- III. Psalm 37:25-26, Isaiah 54:13-14, Psalm 112:1-2, and Psalm 115:13-15 are about your children being blessed.
  - A. God will increase both you and your children.
  - B. Now, this doesn't rule out the fact that your children have a choice of their own to make, to trust God or not.

- C. This doesn't mean that they will automatically be forced to do the right thing, but your children will be blessed.
- IV. Aaron was the high priest, and he was anointed with oil, which symbolizes the Holy Spirit.

Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity! [2] It is like the precious ointment upon the head, that ran down upon the beard, even Aaron's beard: that went down to the skirts of his garments. [3] As the dew of Hermon, and as the dew that descended upon the mountains of Zion: for there the LORD commanded the blessing, even life for evermore.

Psalm 133:1-3

- A. On whom did God command this blessing?
- B. On those who dwell together in unity.
- C. These verses say that there is a blessing that comes on people when they are in unity that won't manifest any other way.
- V. Strife is an inroad of Satan:

For where envying and strife is, there is confusion and every evil work.

James 3:16

- A. Some people think, Well, I'm not giving place to the devil, yet they're mad, in strife, and bitter.
- B. If you're self-willed and stubborn, those are the same as the sins of witchcraft and idolatry:

For rebellion is as the sin of witchcraft, and stubbornness is as iniquity and idolatry.

1 Samuel 15:23

- C. Maybe you were raised to think that living in strife is just the way it has to be.
- D. That's not true.

VI. When the believers were all together in unity, the power of the Holy Spirit fell:

And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. [2] And suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting.

Acts 2:1-2

- A. Unfortunately, the body of Christ is so divided today.
- B. The body is separated from and angry with each other.
- C. Nobody will fellowship with anybody who's different than they are.
- D. The church has all this strife, yet we wonder why we're struggling.

VII. You turn Satan loose when you are angry (James 3:16).

- A. You might say, "But, Andrew, I just need to get it off my chest."
- B. No, you just need to repent and get over it.
- C. Pride is the only reason for this strife:

Only by pride cometh contention.

Proverbs 13:10

- D. It's what is inside of you—your pride, your selfishness—that makes you angry.
- E. Although God commands His blessing on unity, it's not even a goal for most people.
- F. They're mad, and they just don't care.
- G. They think that they're hurting this other person by harboring unforgiveness.
- H. No, they're hurting themselves.
- I. Satan uses that as an inroad into their lives.
- J. It stops the blessing of God.
- K. They need to forgive and start walking in love.

VIII. We as the church need to be in unity.

- A. Some things just cannot be done on an individual basis.
- B. America isn't going to turn back to God because of one person.
- C. We as the church have to change the hearts of people.
- D. American voters elect people into office who reflect their morals.
- IX. John Adams, the first vice president and the second president of the United States, basically said that democracy is totally unfit or unsuited for anybody but a moral people.
  - A. If America ever ceases to be moral, democracy will destroy its people.
  - B. That's what is happening today.

Righteousness exalteth a nation: but sin is a reproach to any people.

Proverbs 14:34

- C. If you're an American, then you ought to exercise your right to vote because it's irresponsible not to, and when you do, be sure to vote according to godliness, not outward appearance.
- D. Compared to righteousness, things like good looks, gender, and color aren't important.
- E. If you do what God is leading you to do, and if every other Christian goes out as salt and light and does what the Lord wants them to do, this nation could turn back to God (Matt. 5:13-16).

[11] Blessed are ye, when men shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake. [12] Rejoice, and be exceeding glad: for great is your reward in heaven: for so persecuted they the prophets which were before you.

Matthew 5:10-12

- A. Someday you will stand before God, and He will honor you in front of all creation.
- B. People who have never heard of you will see you rewarded because you stood up for the Lord and suffered the criticism, rejection, and persecution of other people.

- C. If you understood this, you could rejoice.
- D. When you understand that when you're persecuted for righteousness' sake, it's like a crown that you could wear, then you'll look forward to persecution (Phil. 3:10).
- E. You should not be unwise and cause persecution to come your way, but when it does come due to your godly life, you can look forward to it because you know that the Lord will bless you for it.
- IV. By Jesus's own words, we who hear the Word of God and keep it are more blessed than even His mother was:

And it came to pass, as he spake these things, a certain woman of the company lifted up her voice, and said unto him, Blessed is the womb that bare thee, and the paps which thou hast sucked. [28] But he said, Yea rather, blessed are they that hear the word of God, and keep it.

Luke 11:27-28

- A. We're blessed!
- B. Givers are more blessed than receivers:

It is more blessed to give than to receive.

Acts 20:35

- C. If we truly understood this, we would choose to be generous givers because we get blessed when we give.
- V. If you can't believe, it's because you willed not to believe (John 20:25).
  - A. You chose to believe something else instead of the report of the Lord.
  - B. Your mind is in the way.
  - C. You've educated yourself right out of faith.
  - D. The greatest faith that the Lord ever saw was a faith that simply took Him at His Word (Matt. 8:10).
  - E. The least faith that Jesus ever saw was Thomas's faith (John 20:29), who basically said "Lord, I believe" (John 20:28) only after he saw Jesus risen from the dead.
